## **IOB PURPOSE:**

Consortium partners (State Anchors) are responsible for the implementation of the project at the state level and will recruit a State Training Coordinator (STC) to work with the respective S-MoEST. Each State Training Coordinator is employed by a consortium member organization and will be based in the state capital. State Training Coordinator will represent the PSLP to the State Ministry of Education (SMoE) and will report to their respective NGO (State Anchor). At national level, State Anchors will report to the Senior Program Manager of the PSLP for thematic leadership. This position will coordinate the courses across counties and ensure the multi-modal programme is delivered as required

The State Training Coordinator will also ensure all data is collected and submitted as required by the programme's M&E system, and compile progress reports for submission to the state coordination committee and for the national quarterly report which is submitted to the PLSP Reference Group.

#### **KEY AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY:**

- Manage a partnership with relevant offices within the S-MoEST and all county education offices.
- Establish and convene the S-MoEST PSLP Coordination Committee to meet on a quarterly basis
- Manage a team of PSLP trainers in conjunction with S-MoEST
- Represent the PSLP on relevant state and non-state education forums
- Monitor (closely) all participants on the basic and accredited courses (strands 3+4) and ensure their progress is fully documented
- Ensure all PSLP MEAL systems are fully in place, functional and all data updated
- Manage the state PSLP budget, monitoring expenditure on a monthly basis
- Manage all reporting required by the project, ensuring all deadlines are met
- Produce and maintain quarterly work-plans
- Demonstrate flexibility and responsiveness throughout
- Ensure full adherence to the achievement of all deliverable targets, while understanding the project operates on a payment by results mechanism
- Provide Quality Assurance and Quality Control on all the work delivered by the training team
- Be in frequent contact with the Senior Program Manager for the consortium, following guidance where required
