Call for Partnership (CFP) No. 2

Building Resilience of Smallholders and Market Actors Implementation in Twic East, Jonglei State

Application Dates: 30th November to 7th December, 2018.

Grant Size: Ceiling US\$41,000

Grant Types: Sub grant Cash for activity periods no longer than 1 year

I: Building Resilience of Smallholders & Market Actors

Norwegian People's Aid (NPA) is non-Governmental International Organization involved in humanitarian, relief and long-term development cooperation in south Sudan. It has been working in South Sudan since 1986 and currently runs three Programs Partnership vis-à-vis Civil Society development, Rural Development, and Emergency Response programmes respectively. NPA is currently implementing the Building Resilience of Smallholders and Market Actors (BRSMA) project in Bor South & Twic East Counties in Jonglei state; Awerial counties in Eastern Lakes State and in Terekeka Counties respectively under the Rural Development Programme. The project is now in its third year of implementation Phase III, is running from **01st June, 2018 to 30th May 2019**. The development Goal of the project is: *To contribute to resilience and livelihoods recovery of conflict-affected host communities and returnees in South Sudan; with an Outcome, 'Increased economic and productive self-sufficiency of returnees & host communities in Terekeka, Awerial, Twic East and Bor Counties.* NPA is therefore making a call for suitably qualified local NGOs to partner with them in the implementation of the project in **Twic East County, Jonglei State**.

II: Grant objective/Purpose of the call

The identified partner will be responsible for project implementation in the target areas based on the outputs stated below;

Output 1, Targeted households and communities are able to restore/maintain their productive capacity when faced with, chronic, transitory or cyclical shocks and activities are: Establish (1) small holder seed enterprises (SSEs) as risk reduction measure (20-25 members); Establishment of (3) community food banks as community based risk management strategy and Promote production in schools for school Feeding in (1) schools

Output 2, Targeted households and communities have increased access to knowledge and support services for productive activities; and activities are: Strengthen extension system and crop husbandry practices through establishment of (2) new Farmer Field Schools to train 50 (25 farmers per FFS); Establish (1) Pastoral Field Schools (PFSs) to train 10 livestock keepers/agro Train and support 2 women fish preservation and marketing groups (15-20members/group) =40.



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Output 3, Livelihood assets of returnee and host community livestock keepers restored and protected through training.

Provision of veterinary health services on cost recovery basis through training and equipping 02 CAHWs

Output 4, Input supply system for smallholder farmers and community animal health workers strengthened with two key activities: technical and financial support to input market actors to (1) Agro dealers.

Outputs 5: Organizational and institutional capacity of producer and marketing groups strengthened with activities of: Training 50 members on group dynamics, group leadership and gender equity; Training and support groups to form VSLAs, 2* 25 VLSA to be supported with Kit; and Organize/facilitate formation of stakeholder forums (County level) targeting 50 representative per County *1 = 50 members

III: Grant Categories

The sub-grant is meant for carrying out the activities in order to meet the outputs mentioned above; at the same time disbursing revolving grant to project beneficiaries following procedures of grant mechanism already in place. The aspiring CBO/Partner is expected to provide a Technical proposal and methodology and budget in the implementation of the Project taking into consideration the specified counties and targets allocated. Applicants are expected to provide a clear work plan for the entire project period and monitoring plan are to be submitted together with the proposal. Templates can be obtained from NPA offices in Juba and sub offices in Bor, Awerial, Rumbek and Yirol.

IV: Grant Restrictions

Grant is not meant to buy assets.

V: Eligibility for applications:

The eligibility of the applicant should be a registered CBO/LLO with relevant authorities and should have physical presence in the areas mentioned and with experiences in implementation of such activities. The applicant should have bank account within the Country and relevant previous recommendation similar work done elsewhere.
