Function Description:

Veterinarian 2 plans, implements and monitors the Economic Security (EcoSec) Unit's livestock programmes in line with the country strategy and under the supervision and guidance of their hierarchical superior.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- Identify needs and geographical areas of intervention, in collaboration with EcoSec SD/Juba.
- Support in the planning and preparation of EcoSec activities, in close collaboration with the EcoSec Delegate and the team.
- Advice and support EcoSec Team with the implementation of agro- and livestock-based livelihood support initiatives.
- Scope new areas of intervention, design and contribute in the implementation of relevant emergency interventions.
- Ensure appropriate internal technical reporting.
- Attend relevant external coordination meetings, as deemed relevant/needed.
- Implement agro/livestock programs, through coordination with relevant local governmental authorities.
- Ensure operational tracking, filing and follow-up.
- Ensure appropriate use of logistics databases (FSS – Field Supply Systems).
- Maintain clear record of financial expenditures when in the field, ensuring timely clearance of cash advance.
- Ensure that all FTRs (Field Trip Reports) are submitted to the Line Manager in a timely fashion.
- Represents ICRC in Agro and, when required, Livestock sector meetings in the respective field program locations.
- Whenever required, he/she will contribute to other EcoSec programs outside the Livestock program, by working together with other team members at any stage of the project cycle either it is assessment, project design, implementation or monitoring and evaluation or any other support needed based on operational need.
- In collaboration with Livestock JUB team and EcoSec MAL, assist in the design, planning, implementation and monitoring of livestock programs (i.e., treatment and vaccination campaigns) in South Sudan, in cooperation with local communities and authorities (MLFI).
- Prepare for the organisation and the delivery of Community Animal Health Workers (CAHW) training courses, as well as the treatment and vaccination campaigns.

- Actively participate to household assessment and focus group discussions with the livestock owners and prepare questionnaires for data entry.
- Independently perform data entry and the analysis of the household assessment.
- Provide regular and consistent reporting on the activities carried out in the field, as well as appropriate internal technical reporting.
- Provide regular updates to Line Manager on livestock-related issues, particularly the impact of displacement and conflict on the Livestock file.
- Keep track of the livestock activities of other humanitarian actors in the Upper Nile region, so to avoid duplications and seek for operational collaboration.
- Conduct pre- and post- distribution monitoring, assessment and reporting.
- Conduct pre- and post- harvest assessment and reporting.
- Prepare and submit EPMT (Ecosec Program Management Tool), MSR (Monthly Statistical Reports) and FSS (logistical reports) on a monthly basis.
- Prepare and submit regular Field Trip Reports to the line manager (EcoSec Delegate) within 2 days of field trip.
- Respect, observe and provide guidance on the application of the ICRC South Sudan staff regulations.
- Work collaboratively within the team, propose solutions and communicate constructively.
- Apply the Code of Conduct at all times.
- Respect and strictly abide by the ICRC Security Rules.
- Work in close interaction with the colleagues of the department, providing help and support when needed.
- Show respect and sensitivity towards cultural and religious differences.
- Show tolerance and consideration for others.
- Represent the ICRC in a professional manner maintaining the position as an observer in public meetings
- Encourage organisational and individual responsibility towards the community and the environment.
- A flexible team player, performing tasks not covered in this job description when deemed necessary.

Minimum required knowledge & experience:

- University degree in Veterinary Medicine / Animal Health
- At least 3 years in livestock-related programs and humanitarian projects in South Sudan
- Extensive knowledge of the livestock sector of South Sudan as well as of the most prevalent animal diseases, animal treatment and vaccination, main migration routes, livestock markets and institutional policies
- Additional vocational training in humanitarian development, economic development, food security, humanitarian law and/or equivalent fields an advantage.
- Sound knowledge of project management (assessment, proposals writing). Very good report writing and in possess of analytical skills.
- Very good command of written and spoken English.
- Good command of spoken/written Arabic and/or Nuer/Dinka an advantage.
- Very good computer skills, with a particular predisposition for Microsoft Excel and Word.
- A team player, with a capacity to prioritize tasks under tight deadlines.
- Knowledge of ICRC's core mandate, mission and working modalities.
- Driving license (manual gear cars) an asset.
- Flexibility and willingness to travel extensively in the Upper Nile region (70-75% of working time)
