Purpose of the position:

The Nutrition Manager-SSHF2 project will have overall responsibility for coordination of all Nutrition project activities under SSHF2 in Tambura. He/She will be responsible for technical leadership and administrative oversight of the project and will serve as the principal institutional liaison to the HPF project manager, SSHF Health manager, County Health Department and local government entities at county level.

Major Roles and Responsibilities of position

- Monitor the nutrition medical activities by ensuring data collection, compilation and entry into the NIS and contribute to the analysis and reporting of the data
- Ensure that Nutrition services in the area of implementation are designed, managed and implemented in conformity with national and international protocols
- Manage proactive and responsive relationship with county authorities in close collaboration with other health project in the area.
- Directly oversee project implementation of the Nutrition emergency project, ensuring that all strategic objectives are met through proper design, staffing, implementation and quality assurance at county level.

- Supervise the clinical officer and nutrition nurses and build capacity of health workers and nutrition assistants in the PHCUs to manage health activities.
- Establish and maintain effective project reporting, evaluation, and communication systems. Submit timely accurate and professional reports that meet donor requirements.
- Liaise with local government officials, local communities, donor representatives and other stakeholders as appropriate and in close collaboration to the Project Manager HPF
- Participate in proposal development
- Respond to adhoc project and donor requests at all times.

Technical roles

- Make adequate nutrition requests from the core pipe lines (UNICEF and WFP) and ensure proper tracking of their usage and reporting.
- Provide leadership in the implementation of Nutrition in the Project area as guided by the project objectives, logical framework and work plan; and guided by the southern Sudan Health Policy, WVI and other international standards; participate in any Health program management in the county, representing World Vision in many technical forums at county level and State level.
- Start and operationalize a stabilization center in Tambura hospital
- Liaise with P&C and county medical officer in recruitment and mentoring of project staff such as nutrition nurses and nutrition assistants.
- In collaboration with State and County Health authorities, take stock, develop distribution plans and distribute health awareness and learning materials to targeted communities;
- In liaison with CHD conduct monthly and quarterly supervisory visits to the OTPs/TSFPs facilities.
- Ensure that MUAC screening is done at community level by CNVs and HHPs.
- Improve nutrition indicators.
- Ensure that HF provide timely and high quality weekly, Monthly and quarterly reports.
- Ensure infection prevention is highly observed in all the health facility.
- Establish proper waste disposal mechanisms are in place in all the health facilities.
- Ensure that nutrition interventions are linked to the health facility interventions.
- Carry out additional responsibilities and projects as assigned, including administrative and planning functions.
- Conduct county level monthly and quarterly supervisions and review meetings.
- Support the county to develop work plans including emergency response plans.
- Ensure that HHPs are trained to assess and refer malnourished children to the OTPs
- Organize and ensure that nutrition outreaches are conducted as per SSHF2 project.
- Plan and implement mass nutrition screening campaigns.
- To implement a CMAM and TSFP program - targeting malnourished children and pregnant and lactating mothers and other vulnerable groups considered at risk of malnutrition. Set up a commodity supply system that maintains a regular supply of foodstuffs, medicines, good storage of all commodities and efficient safe distribution to the beneficiaries in all the project sites.

Budget management

- The Nutrition manager will be a budget holder for the SSHF2
- Conduct regular budget reviews to ensure that spending is on track.
- Responsible for ensuring that all procurements requests are done in a timely manner.
- Develop procurement and spending plans for the project.
- Take lead in requesting advances for purposes of implementation

Leadership roles/staff management

- Directly supervise and manage the clinical officer and nurses ensuring performance management and appraisals are done in a timely manner.
- Provide mentorship and on job coaching and training to staff under supervision.
- Adapts leadership style to new environments and cultures
- Respects various Christian expressions
- Creates awareness/understanding on cross-cultural issues
- Seeks to understand and respect differing perspectives and viewpoints
- Uses different styles to impact different individuals or groups

Work relations

- Directly report to the Project Manager HPF
- Indirectly report to ARP Coordinator Tambura, Health Sector Specialist and Zonal Program Manager.
- Work in close collaboration with other program sector heads, MNCH and the Nutrition Coordinators.
- Liaise with logistics, admin, finance and P&C to ensure that project support needs are met.
- Work closely with the CHD and other SMoH focal persons

Qualifications: Education/Knowledge/Technical Skills and Experience

The following may be acquired through a combination of formal or self-education, prior experience or on-the-job training:

- A University Degree in Medicine, Public health, Nutrition, Nursing, Public Health, Nursing with at least 3-4 years hand-on experience in busy INGOs; a master's degree (or equivalent) preferably public health an asset.
- Thorough knowledge and skills of nutrition and primary health care related programs in rural situations in South Sudan;
- General understanding of health service delivery, especially those related to nutrition
- Thorough knowledge of the HRP and nutrition cluster strategies
- Prior extensive project implementation experience.
- A wide range of technical expertise, professional competence and relevant academic background in human capacity building in the health sector, particularly maternal nutrition and child health and family planning.
- Project management certificate is essential.
- Good time management and organizational skills: Able and willing to meet deadlines and agreed objectives
- Strong willingness to meet the customers' (clients) needs, while balancing the organization's needs and priorities

- Fluency in English language and the local languages spoken is an added advantage.
