CUAMM's aim is to improve maternal, neonatal and child health, through a comprehensive approach of health system strengthening considering communities, health facilities and hospitals as interlinked elements. Currently, CUAMM's operating areas are in former Lakes and Western Equatoria States.

CUAMM is looking for a suitable candidate to fill the position **Nutrition Manager to be based in different location, covering nutrition activities**

The Nutrition Manager will manage the implementation and growth of our nutrition programme, working closely with the health programme team to deliver a coordinated response to chronic food shortages and the risk of high rates of child malnutrition. S/he will be responsible of the capacity building of national staff, enabling them to properly respond to MAM and SAM cases, and following-up IYCF projects. S/he will also ensure high-quality, timely, valid and verifiable data collection and analysis, and develop and implement a learning agenda to inform and disseminate project results to policy makers and other stakeholders of the lessons learned. S/he will support our health team to integrate nutrition within health programs, reporting to the Area Manager.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Ensure the implementation of the Nutrition programme through all stages of the project management cycle, with a focus on the achievement of results and quality of activities.
2. Work with the M & E Department to strengthen and maintain a project monitoring and evaluation system, including an effective field reporting system that will enable measurement of progress at output and outcome levels.

3. Liaise with other departments including finance/administration, procurement and human resource departments to ensure adequate support for all project activities.
4. Facilitate integration between nutrition and other CUAMM programmes, particularly Health, to contribute to outcome level results.
5. Assist with building capacity of Health Facilities' staff to deliver nutrition services to the community
6. Take the lead in monitoring and evaluation of nutrition programme activities and regularly report on progress and lessons learned.
7. Ensure annual nutrition surveys are conducted to inform programme implementation
8. Ensure compliance donor regulations, international standards relating to nutrition programmes and government requirements in relation to programme operations
9. Assist in the review and compilation of concept notes and proposals, adhering to the schedule as identified in the country strategic plan
10. Represent the organization and coordinate with partners, authorities and local actors involved in the implementation of Nutrition programs.
