ICAP IN SOUTH SUDAN

ICAP at Columbia University is an international NGO funded by PEPFAR through CDC. ICAP in South Sudan has partnered with the Ministry of Health-RSS to increase uptake and improve quality of HIV prevention, care and treatment services through technical assistance and capacity building.

OVERALL JOB FUNCTION:

To provide quality HIV testing and Counseling Services (HTS) to every client according to the National HTS Guideline

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Ensures that all client get pre- test information and informed consent before HIV testing
 - Ensure all the test kits and other supplies are available and has valid expiry dates before testing.
 - Create relationship and provide conducive environment to clients
 - Explain confidentiality
 - Review a client's risk assessment and risk reduction Plan
 - Ensure client understands HIV rapid test procedures and the meaning of test result.
 - Help client think about possible reactions to the test result and whom to inform

2. Provide post test counseling to every clients according to the national guideline

- Provide appropriate coping information for clients who are tested HIV positive.
- Provide preventive information package for clients who are tested HIV negative.
- Help clients who are tested HIV positive to join HIV support group.
- Explore the issue of disclosure with clients and, where appropriate, assist them in disclosing their status to relevant parties



 Help clients develop a supportive and nurturing environment, experience selfsufficiency, and gain a sense of control over their health in general.

3. Linkage to care and treatment

- Collaborate with ART Nurses to ensure all HIV positive patients are linked to HIV care and treatment
- Where necessary escort HIV positive clients to the ART Clinic for treatment
- Record the client's unique ART number from the feedback form into the respective HTS Register.
- Work together with HTS focal person to ensure HTS tools are available and updated accordingly all the time

EDUCATION

- Secondary School certificate with formal training in HIV Counseling and testing
 Desirable Qualification
 - Ability to Provide quality HIV Testing services with least 2 years experiences in similar position in South Sudan
 - Demonstrates effective oral, written and non-verbal communication skills appropriate for the specific work setting
 - Upholds patient & facility confidentiality
 - Person familiar with MOH HTS recording and reporting tools is an added advantage
 - Willing to work in the facility for all working days of the week.
 - Must be a South Sudanese National
