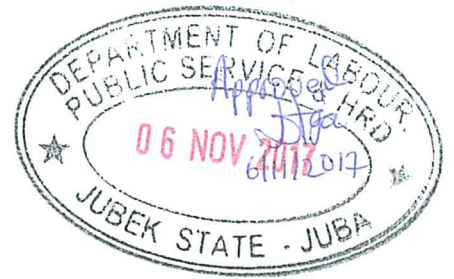

- Provide expertise on local humanitarian leadership to the Oxfam confederation and through the Oxfam Research Network
- Provide general research support and expertise to Oxfam South Sudan and its national partners, (20% FTE) including training and advisory sessions on commissioning and managing research.

SKILLS EXPERIENCE AND KNOWLEDGE

- Education in social sciences to degree level, or equivalent. Post-graduate and other training qualifications an advantage
- A track record of high quality research in humanitarian issues
- Proven research, writing and analytical skills as well as up-to-date research methods
- At least 3 years' experience conducting and managing research projects, ideally in South Sudan
- Strong communication skills, both spoken and written, to engage authoritatively with non-specialised audiences with proven ability to present complex issues in clear terms
- Proven ability to organise, plan and prioritise work
- Ability to work effectively in a team which includes members at a distance
