Organizational background

IMA World Health is seeking applications for a Team Leader for an anticipated DFID-funded programme in South Sudan. The Integrated Community Case Management 2 (ICCM2) programme aims to improve access to life-saving health treatments for children suffering from malaria, diarrhoea, pneumonia and severe acute malnutrition (SAM) and contribute to a reduction in the under-five child mortality rate in South Sudan. The ICCM2 programme will continue to ensure essential medicines are available to community based distributors across 8 states in South Sudan. The Team Leader will provide managerial and technical oversight for all programme outputs including increasing the provision of ICCM services, strengthening health systems in intervention areas, and increasing quality, demand, and use of nutrition services in programme areas.

Duties:

- Responsible for overall management, implementation and planning for the programme.
- Establish the administrative framework to monitor and assure progress toward the achievement of the goals and objectives of the programme.
- Serve as IMA's representative to DFID, the South Sudan government including the MoH, other donors and multinationals, technical agencies, and other stakeholders and partners.
- Ensure timely communications and reporting to DFID and other stakeholders as appropriate.
- Ensure visibility of program results, achievements and lessons learned through presentations at conferences and workshops and/or publishing articles through professional journals.
- Ensure technical capacity of staff and provide technical assistance and backstopping when required.
- Ensure project expenses are reasonable and in accordance with donor rules and regulations.
- Supervises all technical staff and consultants.

The position requires a competent and experienced person with the following attributes:

- Master's degree in a relevant discipline (PhD strongly preferred).
- At least 7 years experience managing health sector programs (experience in community-level health, oversight of health service delivery, and familiarity with health system in South Sudan preferred).
- At least 3 years of experience managing large teams and stakeholder relationships.
- At least 5 years proven experience managing and implementing donor funded health programs, DFID experience strongly preferred.
- Experience working and delivering results in conflict/post conflict countries.
- Strong English oral and written communication skills.
