Background:

South Sudan Grassroots Initiative for Development (SSGID) is a non-profit making organization that was founded in South Sudan in 2013 a group of Youths and women with the aim of responding to the ever increasing social, economic, health and illiteracy challenges facing many people in South Sudan. SSGID is legally registered in South Sudan as national Humanitarian and Development community organization with the Relief and Rehabilitation Commission (Registration Number 350). SSGID core sectors of work include Food Security & Livelihoods, WASH, Education, Health and Peace Building as these are the most development aspects that South Sudan needs to attain the sustainable development (SDGs).

SSGID in partnership with World Vision South Sudan has secured funding from BMZ for implementation of a five years project on food security and livelihoods in Gogrial West County. The project aims at improving agricultural productivity by providing capacity building, extension services and improved farming technology to farmers. In addition to targeting mothers and caregivers, to support them to improve their knowledge on prevention of malnutrition and to adopt positive health seeking behaviors for themselves and their children under the age of 5 years.

SSGID therefore seeks to recruit a highly competent Project Manager -Food Security and Livelihood from 01 January 2018 to oversee the implementation of the project in Gogrial West County - Warrap State. The initial contract will be for a period of 1 year with possibility of extension upon performance.

ROLE PURPOSE

Under the direct supervision of the Project Manager World Vision, the Project Manager – will lead the implementation of the project in Gogrial West Country, Warrap State through sustainable and innovative livelihood interventions. The role has a significant administrative focus on comprehensive planning and quality delivery of food security and nutrition activities.



Key Jobs Responsibilities

The Project Manager h/s will perform the following functions-

Technical

- Provide leadership and coordinate implementation of the food security and livelihoods, and nutrition activities in all participating payams.
- Be in charge of planning and reporting; develop timely monthly, quarterly, and annual work plans and reports and ensure all project outcomes are achieved.
- Lead the field-level implementation of activities using appropriate SSGID and World Vision project management tools to plan, review and track progress and quality by the project team.
- Provide capacity building to project staff under his/her supervision and ensure staffs has adequate knowledge of implementation methodology, project deliverables and donor requirement.
- Ensure staff have adequate technical capacity and conduct regular review meetings to appraise as well as to encourage staff to improve performance.
- Organize capacity building activities to staff and volunteers in the project.
- Ensure effective liaison with local government officials, local communities, donor representatives and other stakeholders, making use of an appropriate accountability framework.
- Facilitate development of data collection tools, effective monitoring of project activities and ensure documentation of success stories, best practices, lessons learned and other relevant information to the project.
- Oversee identification and training of extension workers, volunteers and lead farmers.
- Promote community sensitization and involve residents in the planning, implementation, and monitoring of project activities in all target areas.
- Provide oversight and ensure establishment of farmer field schools and demonstration plots on improved agricultural practices and animal traction.
- Maintain quality in project delivery including monitoring system for tracking of project progress against indicators, activities and key project milestones, reporting, evaluation, and communication systems.

- Conduct regular visits to field sites for the purpose of monitoring the progress of implementation and offering field based support to project staff.
- Supervise the Training of farmers on improved agricultural practices
- Oversee the distribution of improved crop seeds, vegetable kits and gardening tools to farmers and mothers/caregivers
- Supervisor the establishment of seed multiplication groups and training of extension workers and farmers on seed multiplication
- Support mothers/care givers in the establishment of nutritional homestead gardens and conduct appropriate trainings
- Lead the development and distribution of project IEC materials
- Coordinate the establishment of mother/caregiver groups and trainings on common childhood illnesses, maternal, infant and young child feeding

- Communicate regularly with local actors and project stakeholders on project progress, and generally represent SSGID in relevant coordination meetings.
- Assist in the coordination of visits of SSGID, donor and partner staff as needed to program site
- In consultation with technical leads, contribute to development of food security and nutrition project proposals and project budgets
