AIM OF THE POSITION

• As an integral part of a multi-disciplinary team, Health Field Officer 3 (Clinical Officer) promotes and ensures the delivery of high-quality patient care primarily in the Out Patient Department (OPD) aimed at reaching national/international standards depending on the context. S/he works to build capacity in patient diagnosis, treatment and in the ICRC supported hospital often working with limited resources and in challenging conditions. The Field Officer Clinical Officer is a member of the ICRC Hospital Team in Akobo County Hospital. S/he works in partnership with the Surgeon, the Anaesthetist, paediatrician, OT nurse and the mobile ward nurse. S/he is under the Hospital Project Manager.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- Provides high-quality care to patients, following the ICRC's guidelines and in cooperation with other members of the hospital team.
- Ensures that patients are triaged to the Emergency Room or the OPD according to their conditions
 and that appropriate treatments are prescribed and dispensed following the ICRC's, national and
 WHO guidelines as follows the activities of the national EPI program in cooperation with other
 members of the hospital team.
- Participates in delivering a training/coaching programme to measurably improve the quality of patient care.
- Promotes a clean and safe patient environment and ensures that hygiene conditions are regularly measured and maintained in line with ICRC standards.
- Ensures accurate data collection through the timely completion and filing of all patient/hospitalrelated documents.
- Participates effectively in any emergency-preparedness or response measures undertaken by the team or hospital.
- Cooperates and collaborates with and provides any relevant support to both internal and external counterparts and partners.
- · Collects and ensures proper management of information and assists in relevant reporting.
- Makes sure that available resources are used rationally and that supplies are reordered; ensures that equipment is properly used and maintained.
- Ensures that all items required for patient care are available.
- To be flexible and perform tasks not covered in this job description.
- Provides the safest possible care according to the local capacity and environment.

- Participates, leads and plans trainings for local staff.
- Ensures the national and ICRC protocols are followed and adapted to the circumstances.
- · Assists in identifying patients that require emergency interventions and initiates treatment.
- Accompanies patients that require admission to the wards and ensures clear handover to local staff.
- Monitors the ongoing needs for stock and utilises Imprest system for reordering
- Attends regular hospital team meetings.
- Provides ward statistics as required and participate in providing information for monthly and quarterly reporting.

Education and experience required

- Diploma or degree as a clinical officer or equivalent experience;
- 3-5 years of experience in humanitarian work / health;
- Good level of written and spoken English and Arabic:
- Nuer language an asset;
- Intermediate level in computer skills (Word, Excel and Power-point);
- Ability to master the following competencies: Representing the ICRC; Adapting & Learning; Communication (ability to express and exchange views and ideas); Analysis & Synthesis
- Understanding of ICRC mandate, International Humanitarian Law, and other humanitarian topics
- Good knowledge of geographically assigned environment (Jonglei);
- · Willingness to learn and adapt;
