### Organizational Background

### Essential Job duties / Scope of Work:

*Based in Maban the clinical officers will work under the direct supervision of primary health coordinator and senior clinical officer and take the overall responsibility of managing clients / patients who are seeking medical attention on daily basis in the IMC Maban clinics and execute any other additional tasks given by the immediate supervisors*

### Responsibilities

- *Build technical capacity of the health service providers, community health promoters, Traditional Birth Assistants and communities*
- *Ensure availability, functionality and safety of clinical diagnostic tools and equipment in the in the out patients department (OPD)*
- *Manage patients that seek health care services in the IMC clinics in accordance with the national guidelines, protocols and international recommended standard health care practices*

- Carry out minor surgeries, stabilize seriously sick patients and refer clients for further medical care
- Illustrate rational prescription habit in line with current evidence and national guidelines
- Demonstrate universal infection procedure/ practices in the working palaces
- Respect client right and confidentiality of their health information (keep their privacy and confidentiality of medical information, provide appropriate information and allow them to express their concerns and make informed choice)
- Identify, manage and report immediately any outbreak potential reportable diseases
- Document services provided at the OPDs, verify, compile and submit the health care service report to M&E unit on weekly basis
- Routine supportive supervision of clinical practice of lower cadres of PHC staff where appropriate organize need base training /refresher training
- Participate in outbreak prevention control and vaccination campaigns
- Perform other additional activities given by immediate supervisor
- Promote good working relationship between the community members, community health committee and the clinical staff at the PHC clinic through respecting individual rights
- When he/she delegated, overtake the responsibility of senior clinical officer

### **Basic requirements**

- 1-2 years working experience in managing clients at primary health care level facilities and preferably previous working experiences in humanitarian context
- Degree in clinical officer
- South Sudan national
- Fluent in Arabic and in English language
- Have excellent facilitation skill and experience in building capacity of staff
- Excellent written and interpersonal communication skills,
- Demonstrated cross-cultural, teamwork, and computer skills,
- Maintain a positive working relationship with clients and colleagues and embrace professionalism, team work, integrity and medical work ethics
- Actively promote PSEA (Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) standards within International Medical Corps and amongst beneficiaries served by International Medical Corps
- Must be flexible and able to work in a challenging environment with limited resources. (South Sudan experience strongly preferred)
