Introduction

Purpose of this position:

The TB/HIV Clinical Officer is responsible for assisting the Project TB Expect in collaboration with the POC PHC providers and other technical team to pan, coordinate and monitor the implementation of all project components of TB care at supported facilities including TB/HIV, Childhood TB management, drug resistant TB surveillance and management, TB Infection control, DOT strengthening, TB recording and reporting and the application of continuous quality improvement (CQI) approaches to improve TB care.

S/He will also offer Provider Initiated Testing and counselling (PITC) including HIV care and treatment management.

Key Responsibilities and Accountabilities:

- Identify patients with a presumptive TB and ensure to refer patients for the Laboratory sputum smear microscopy for TB diagnosis;
- 2. Refer patients with TB or presumptive TB for hospitalization or further treatment and investigation:
- Actively engage in monitoring the performance and management of primary clinics in presumptive TB screening, referral service and confirmation of the outcome of those clients referred for TB investigation.(confirmed referral, # of TB diagnosed etc)
- 4. Provide TB treatment to patients who need to receive their TB medicines from the Hospital and ensure the direct supervision of treatment and administer the TB treatment to patients in line with the NTLBP requirements and standards.
- 5. Ensure HIV screening and testing to all TB patients identified is registered and the data collection is submitted to the M & E Officer for the statistical analysis.
- Ensure that the TB patients who are identified HIV-positive are registered in the HIV/AIDS registration system of the NACP. Track the registration by use of the patient's referral numbers.





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- Follow-up on TB/HIV patients and ensure that the patients are receiving their antiretroviral (ARV) treatment either in the same Hospital or in the closest ARV sites.
- Ensure to offer TB/HIV services as recommended by the National guidelines by:
 - a. Filling in the TB/leprosy patient card and record in the unit register
 - b. Directly observing TB/leprosy patients on facility based DOT, including those admitted
- Manage the TB/leprosy patients with side-effects, complications or treatment failure and, when necessary, referring them to the next level
- 10. Develope and facilitate the establishment of effective referral links between public and private facilities.
- 11. Attend meeting and submit required reports to share relevant information through CME/CPD sessions at the Hospital
- 12. Be incharge of ordering, receiving, recording and safe custody of drugs and other supplies from the County Health Department Office and UNDP ware house
- 13. Provide health education to TB/HIV and leprosy patients and ensure to increase awareness ti educating the community.
- 14. Actively implement TB infection control measures according to guidelines and standards.
- 15. Plan and prioritize TB/HIV and leprosy activities for the Hospital and including them in the facility
- 16. Ensure to regularly updating TB unit register with information collected from the patients' treatment cards and Laboratory TB registers during sputum follow-up visits.
- 17. Ensure, when indicated, Xpert testing. Ensure that the Xpert machine is available, if not through:
 - the transport patients' specimens or
 - ii) the refer patients to Xpert sites
- 18. Use the registration system required by the NTP (register of presumptive TB patients, request form for TB laboratory testing, TB microscopy register, TB treatment register, TB index case form for contact investigation, transfer and referral forms
- 19. Refer patients to receive their TB treatment in the relevant PHCUs whenever needed:
- 20. Trigger TB contact investigation around the identified TB index cases
- 21. Ensure reporting on quarterly basis as required by the NTLBP policy to the County Health Department on TB notification, TB treatment outcomes and smear conversion at the end of the intensive phase of TB treatment as well as reporting on TB drug availability and needs;
- 22. Ensure that effective data collection, recording and reporting system is in place at the Hospital
- 23. Ensure the availability of equipment, supplies, commodities, medical guidelines, standards and job aids to support program implementation and regularly assess the adequacy of logistics and adequate supplies at the Hospital to ensure uninterrupted high quality services.
- 24. Organize monthly TB/HIV Quality Improvement Teams meetings and lead in QA/QI initiativeness and innovationsa.
- 25. Closely collaborate with CHD and provide support to the relevant PHCCs and PHCUs.
- 26. Attend to other duties as directed and instructed by the Senior Programme Manager.

Required Competencies, Skills and Experience

- 1. Minimum required qualification- Diploma in Clinical Medicine and Community Health and with 4 or more years of experience. A degree in a health realted qualification will be an added advantage.
- Experience of working with TB/DOTS, TB/HIV and ART.
- Significant and up to date knowledge of the current ART, TB/HIV, guidelines, standards, tools and best practices
- Experience in TB/HIV care and treatment program implementation with demonstrable results and expertise in initiating TB/HIV care and treatment services
- Professional experience in training and quality assurance for health services
- Experience with private health care providers
- Demonstrated experience in building partnerships
- Excellent communication skills
- Functional fluency in English, Arabic and Shiluk ABILITATION 10. Experience working in International NGOs and donor organization
- 11. Experience in establishing and sustaining working relationships with the Government of Republic of south Sudan ,County Health Department and facility level

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- 12. Demonstrated experience in organizing and facilitating training, mentorship and capacity building of HCWs in TBHIV prevention, care and treatment areas.
- 13. Proficiency in computer basic skills- MS Office; Internet; Basic data analysis skills
- 14. Self- managed, self-driven, results oriented individual with excellent communication, interpersonal, report writing and analytical skills
- 15. Dedicated team player with ability and experience to work in a multidisciplinary team
- 16. Develop annual budgets and work plans for the NTP regarding outreach activities
- 17. Supervise monitoring and evaluation processes and ensure quality and annual production of the NTP Monitoring Reports.
