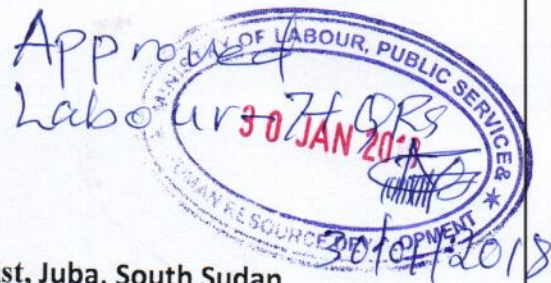

<p>Purpose of the Positions: The incumbent will be responsible for Education thematic strategy development; reviewing current programme to be relevant with unfolding context; conducting needs assessments; ensuring that education needs are addressed on an ongoing basis. He or She will be responsible for providing technical guidance to field-based teams and ensuring that high-quality activities are implemented in a timely manner. He/she will be a lead on developing proposals and securing funding for Education programming. In addition, the incumbent will ensure the coordination of all Education activities through active participation in coordination meetings and working groups. The role is based in Juba with frequent travel to the field.</p>	
<p>Key Responsibilities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lead on Education or multi-sectorial technical assessments in coordination with other external sector agencies, ensuring assessment findings are documented and that all assessments include a specific analysis of need of children & youth. • Lead on developing Education response plans and master budgets and contribute to War Child Canada's overall response strategy. • Lead on fundraising for the Education sector, including development of high quality concept notes and proposals, and engagement with donors' technical advisers. • Provide technical support to Education teams and conduct regular monitoring visits to ensure quality programming is being implemented • Ensure field teams have solid understanding of education in emergency, recovery and development programming, conduct regular trainings for staff to build skills and capacity • Prepare and oversee Education programme implementation to ensure timely delivery of programme activities (for example, monitoring against log frames, individual performance management work plans). • Prepare timely programme and donor reports on project activities in compliance with internal War Child Canada's requirements and any relevant external donor requirements. • Develop learning needs assessment and capacity building plans for both War Child Canada staff and partner staff, linking capacity building initiatives to wider opportunities identified via coordination and networks. • Coach and mentor Education Team / national level counterparts and link in to wider organizational talent development mechanisms. • Oversee development and delivery of technical training material that will improve aspects of Education work within War Child Canada.

This includes overall responsibility for budget and staff management; • Work with local education authority to establish temporary safe learning space that meet the standard requirement. • Oversee project expenditure and hold budget management responsibility for the project, including monitoring budget vs expenditure, ensuring that costs are allocated correctly and expenditure is happening in line with the plan; • Ensure that internal and external reporting requirements are met, including monthly, quarterly and annual narrative reports, in line with the required format and with review and input from technical Education advisors at Juba level;


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- Ensure that project progress is effectively monitored through the regular collection and analysis of key indicators and ensure that processes and results are properly documented;
