### Background

The Rescue Initiative (TRI) South Sudan is a National Non-Governmental Organization that works to alleviate suffering among vulnerable communities in South Sudan, in the areas of Health & Nutrition, Education, Water, Hygiene & Sanitation, Food Security & Livelihoods and Conflict Resolution & Peace Building. Established in 2014 with a group of youth, The Rescue Initiative-South Sudan (TRI-SS) is legally registered with the Ministry of Justice (MoJ), with a license of operation from the Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Disaster Management.

TRI-SS has received funding from AmplifyChange to implement a one-year menstrual hygiene management project. The project aims at increasing individual awareness and access to menstrual hygiene resources, information and services for young people and transforming social norms among communities in Yei River and Juba Counties, South Sudan. It targets girls of school going age, both in and out of school, people with disabilities, survivors of violence (both females and males) and people living with HIV and AIDS. Stakeholders of the project include; community leaders (chiefs, sub-chiefs, county commissioners, county relief and rehabilitation heads and traditional healers), civil society networks (South Sudan women's association, association of women living with HIV), young people (school children, school drop outs, Yei county football association), religious leaders (Muslim and Christian spiritual leaders), united nations population fund (UNFPA), ministry of health (MOH), ministry of education (MOE), school teachers (primary and secondary school), police and parents of school going children. The project targets both IDPs/Refugee/Asylum seekers and host community members. The project officially kicked off on March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 and will end by April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020.

### Purpose of the assignment

To increase individual awareness and transform social norms among communities in Juba and Yei counties.

1. Train teachers on MHM in Schools,
2. Conduct community sensitization on SRHR Menstrual Hygiene management issues,
3. Facilitate radio talk shows with expert guest on SRHR-menstrual hygiene management
4. Facilitate debates in Schools on Menstrual Hygiene Management topics,
5. Facilitate drama sessions in the community on MHM,
6. Participate in the national and state level BCC meetings,
7. Participate in the national reproductive Health forum meetings
8. Engage with youth to increase awareness on areas such as sexually transmitted diseases including HIV/AIDS, Family planning, forced child and early marriage and GBV and other GBV focus areas,
