In 1986, the ICRC expanded its presence to South Sudan. There are around 1,000 ICRC staff working in Juba, Bentiu, Bor, Malakal, Rumbek, and Wau. The ICRC is looking for an enthusiastic and motivated person for the above position.

AIM OF THE POSITION

Under the direct management of the field delegate in charge of Raja/NBeG Area of responsibility (AoR) in the Sub Delegation and the technical supervision and coaching of the Health in Detention delegate in Juba and the Nutritionist delegate, the field officer has the responsibility to:

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- Ensure implementation of the nutrition in detention programme in Places of Detention of the Subdelegation's AoR, that is:
 - o conducting BMI assessments and categorizing SAM and MAM cases,
 - o advising on treatment plan;
 - training and coaching prison medical staff on how to ensure a nutritional follow-up on detainees;
 - liaising with rations/kitchen staff to be updated on the latest rations and nutritional value of food provided by the prison;
 - control stocks of nutritional items to be delivered and available (stocks available in Wau/Juba, stocks available in prisons);
 - preparing ROs for nutritional items to be delivered well in advance;
 - training and coaching SSRC volunteers when and where relevant and stay in regular contact with them for updates on the situation of detainees and of nutritional items stocks.
- Participate in the implementation and organization of ICRC's detention health related activities in places of detention. This includes First Aid training, hygiene promotion session, on the job trainings to medical prison staff on nutrition, malaria, diarrhea management, HIV/AIDS and TB information, education and communication campaign, health needs of mentally ill detainees and detainees with disabilities as well as monitoring of the health prison staff activities. It also includes working with the detention authorities to improve access to health care by the detainees, for example:
 - o Existence of examination upon admission.
 - Capacity to isolate contagious cases.
 - Availability of (qualified) personnel; availability of drugs,

- Availability of referral system for sick detainees/ pregnant detainees (meaning, they have access both to the prison clinic and/or are referred to the hospital in case of need),
- Existence of proper record keeping, including drugs stock, consultations, medical statistics and individual medical files.
- Participate and support the implementation of medical emergency response in case of any outbreak or medical emergency in places of detention;
- Follow specific medical cases that need to be monitored and/or referred to hospital/Physical Rehabilitation Centre with the support and participation of the ICRC delegate;
- Deliver First Aid training in line with Sub Delegation priorities when departmental priorities allow.
- Participate in the implementation of medical or nutrition workshops, roundtables to be organized in Wau or Juba and liaise with the medical authorities;
- Establish and maintain contact under the supervision of the Nutritionist delegate and the Health in Detention delegate, with the SSRC, the MoH and other aid agencies:
- Actively participate and support the Nutritionist and the Health in Detention delegates in the
 planning and preparation of field trips: arrange logistics (hotel bookings, working advances, water
 etc.), prepare and submit field trip forms, organize appointments with interlocutors, prepare field
 equipment, prepare items to be distributed, donation certificates to be signed, etc.
- · Upon request, prepare and conduct field trips independently according to the plan of activities;
- Report the results of his activities in a timely manner and use the tools provided by the Nutritionist and Health in Detention delegates;
- Write reports on the activities including contributions to various ICRC reports, including visit reports, minutes of meetings, field trip report, status of activity, etc.
- Monitor the health detention medical stocks (recording in and out movements, order for replenishment in a timely manner etc.),
- Take responsibility for his own professional learning and development, working closely with his colleagues to improve skills,
- Interpret between Arabic and English and/or between Dinka and English for other ICRC staff if need be.

Minimum required knowledge & experience:

- Medical professional background (Clinical Officer or Registered Nurse) with South Sudan registration and public health experience;
- 3 5 years working experience with thorough knowledge of the South Sudan Health System
- Experience in nutrition and first aid;
- · Advanced conversational in English and Arabic;
- Expert level in computer skills;
- Good knowledge of ICRC mandate, IHL, and of other humanitarian topics;
- · Good knowledge of geographically assigned environment;
- Readiness to spend 50-75% of the time in the field;
- Driving License; Succeeded in ICRC Driving test is an asset
