ultimate goal of increasing the enjoyment of human rights for women and girls, feminist coalition building, women's rights and women's protection and empowerment. The Senior Gender Advocacy and Lobbying Officer, Women's Voices and Leadership will contribute to the successful delivery of the Women Voices and Leadership Programme in South Sudan. The project will enable Women's Rights Organizations from Central Equatoria (Jubek), Jonglei and Eastern Equatoria states to implement their initiatives, strengthen their capacity to promote and defend rights, and empower South Sudan women and girls.

- This project will advance gender equality in South Sudan by contributing to improving:
- The management, programming and sustainability of 15 grassroots women's Rights Organizations.
- The performance, effectiveness and quality of service delivery of Women's Rights Organizations, strengthening women's rights platforms, alliances and networks; and
- The effectiveness of national, State and County Level Women's Rights Organizations' programming and advocacy to influence the development and implementation of gendersensitive policies.
- Reporting to the Program Women's Voices and Leadership, the Senior Gender Advocacy and Lobbying Officer will perform key capacity building, coordination and facilitation roles among grassroots women's organizations and act as the project focal person for CARE in the respective State. The position will assist the Project Manager in mentoring, accompaniment and training, and governance technical support to selected Women's Rights Organisations. The position requires frequent field travel within Eastern Equatoria and Jonglei states. Thus, a high level of cultural sensitivity is required. The Senior Gender Advocacy and Lobbying Programme Officer will ensure that this project contributes to women's Protection and empowerment and gender equality by engaging with many stakeholders.

Responsibilities:

- Planning, implementing and leading implementation of project activities as assigned.
- Preparing the content of and conducting trainings and workshops in project areas either individually, with the project team or grassroots women's organisations.
- Assist the Program Manager and project team in all project areas, as well as Women's Rights
 Organisations and supported Women's focused CSOs to understand gender and power
 dynamics in the project areas, and promote women's leadership and empowerment.
- Support local female leaders to take on leadership roles in their community (this includes supporting the identification of female IDPs to take on roles as community facilitators).
- Support the collection of information and mapping of potential partners, networks, allies, grassroots women's organizations in Eastern Equatoria and Jonglei states.
- Assist in identifying opportunities and engaging with key influencers (power holders) for lobbying and advocacy at the grassroots level.
- Assist in organization and facilitation of joint events with donors, partners, government and beneficiaries.
- Support the production of communication materials (videos, human-interest stories) and information sharing between beneficiaries.
- Assist the Program Manager in developing project reports according to the donor reporting time line and guidelines.

- Take part in coordination and other relevant meeting with partners and attend all staff meeting to brief the CARE program teams on activities.
- Be an active learner and, where required, support the dissemination of good practices internally and externally (either directly or in an advisory capacity to Women's Rights Organisations, supported Women's focused CSOs and networks, alliances and platforms)
- Assist in monitoring the performance of Women's Rights Organisations and supported CSOs in the assigned State.

Qualifications:

- Degree in International Development Women or Gender studies, or a similar Social Science degree with course works in gender equality, rights and international development.
- At least 5 years' experience of working on women's protection and empowerment, gender, transformational leadership, community-based development, human rights and advocacy, facilitation of workshops and training.
- Knowledge and understanding of the context in with respect to issues on gender and gender equality, community-driven leadership and governance in Eastern Equatoria and Jonglei states.
- Good coordination, communication and community facilitation skills.
- Influencing and negotiation skills, with a demonstrated capacity to balance flexibility and tenacity.
- Understanding of basic concepts of humanitarian and development work, and gender related legal frameworks applicable in South Sudan.
- Good information management skills.
- Good written and verbal communication skills in both Arabic and English.
- Excellent interpersonal skills
- Ability to work independently
- Flexible work attitude to manage multiple priorities
- Respecting and valuing diversity
- Eagerness to learn
- Must be willing to be field based in either Eastern Equatoria or Jonglei with frequent travel to various field locations.
- Excellent computer skills (familiarity with Microsoft Office)

Desirable:

- Experience of working in sensitive contexts in South Sudan; working experience in Eastern Equatoria and/ Jonglei
- Arabic language skills would be a strong asset
- Good experience in working with local civil society organisations and local leaders especially on women's transformational leadership.
- Experience in Women's Protection and Empowerment.
