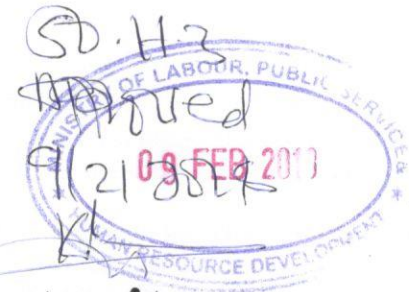

Background:

The Youth Peacemaker Network (YPN) in South Sudan is being implemented by the Whitaker Peace & Development Initiative (WPDI), in partnership with UNESCO, Zain and Ericsson, to empower young people as leaders of peace and development in their communities through a unique mix of peacebuilding, conflict resolution, mediation, life skills, ICT training, vocational training, and youth-led community projects as well as programs promoting peace through the arts and sports.

WPDI is an international nonprofit organization founded by UNESCO Special Envoy for Peace and Reconciliation, Forest Whitaker, with the mission of helping societies affected by destructive conflicts and gang violence transform into safer and more-productive communities. Since its inception in 2012, WPDI has created and managed peacebuilding programs in Uganda, Mexico, South Sudan, the United States, and South Africa. WPDI collaborates with a range of local and international, public and private partners to support its mission.

The YPN provides education and training for youth in peacebuilding, conflict resolution, and life-skills coaching as well as ICT and vocational skills. Additionally, the program empowers local communities

through a series of peacebuilding activities including community projects, the establishment of Community Learning Centers, film screenings, and infrastructure building. The pilot phase of the program was launched in Eastern Equatoria State in 2014 and is now expanding to former Western Equatoria since 2017.

Line with its life-skills and vocational skills objective, WPDI is seeking to introduce the component of **Arts & Craft** in the Community Learning Centers (CLC) in Juba, to harness talents and provide a practical platform to youths and members of the community in and around Juba who want to develop their skills and knowledge in arts & craft further. The Juba CLC was launched in December 2018 and WPDI aims for it to become a one-stop hub for youth activities in education and knowledge sharing. The Juba CLC is in addition to already 9 others that were established - 8 in the former Eastern Equatoria state, 1 in Yambio in Gbudue state. As part of our expansion plan, we are planning to open a CLC in Maridi which will offer daily training in ICT, peacebuilding and access to a library like the others aforementioned.

It is against the above background that WPDI is seeking to recruit a suitably qualified South Sudanese (preferably a residence of Juba) to fill the position of **Arts & Craft Teacher** who will be based and engaged at the Juba CLC. The Arts & Craft Teacher among other roles will be responsible for the following:

- (a) Day to day teaching of students/participants of the Arts & Craft session at the Juba Community Learning Center.
- (b) Design and contextualize the arts & crafts curriculum for its full implementation at the CLC in Juba and ensure that the trainings met the market needs for potential job opportunities of trainees.
- (c) Ensure all required mediums/equipment for effective delivery of the arts & craft training are in place.
- (d) Ensure the work space for the arts & craft session at the Juba Community Learning Center is safe, clean/neat and well-kept during and after usage by the youths and community members thereof.
- (e) Maintain and update the list of equipment, medium and materials available at the Juba Community Learning Center and ensure their use for the youth and community members thereof.
- (f) Prepare and constantly update program and schedule of activities at the center and ensure their execution as planned.
- (g) Mobilize youth, community members and children to come to the center and attend the arts & crafts classes.
- (h) Conduct the arts & crafts training in all its levels at the Juba Community Learning Center as per agreed schedule and using WPDI approved materials.
- (i) Develop and implement training program for the Juba Community Learning Center that will include mentorship and daily motivation of the youth to encourage their participation.
- (j) To comply with and execute the business model that may from time to time during the term/period of this Agreement be developed and made by the WPDI to ensure success and sustainability of this Community Learning Center.

- (k) Collect data, prepare and provide WPDI with monthly progress report of activities at this Community Learning Center in accordance with the WPDI's templates.
- (l) Collect and provide testimonies from the beneficiaries of the CLC as requested;
- (n) Regularly update WPDI in writing on any shortcoming and challenge issues at this Community Learning Center as well as on any other problems related to the effective execution of the arts & crafts training.
- (o) Organizing this Community Learning Center as needed, and providing guidance and support where necessary for the proper usage of the facilities therein and benefit of the entire community members;
- (p) Any other assignment or program or project that may be introduced by WPDI from time to time.

Qualifications

The applicant should have at least a Diploma or its equivalency in arts & craft or related discipline from a recognized institution and prior experience in conducting training and or teaching in a related field. Knowledge and experience in management will be an added advantage
