	<ul> <li>Ensure the dispensing of sugar water and F75 upon admittance.</li> <li>Calculation, preparation, distribution and monitoring of therapeutic milk (F-75, F-100) according to the standard protocols for the beneficiaries.</li> <li>Encouragement of breastfeeding and initiate supplementary Suckling technique (SST) for appropriate infants.</li> <li>Ensure the anthropometric follow up of the patients on daily basis;</li> <li>Ensure that the patients are vaccinated;</li> <li>Ensure the daily medical surveillance of the patients (vital signs)</li> <li>Ensure correct dosage of medications according to the systematic treatment protocol and medical prescriptions by medical officer.</li> <li>Monitor, prevent and treat hypothermia in consultation with the in charge doctor.</li> <li>Monitor, prevent and treat hypoglycemia in consultation with the in charge doctor.</li> <li>Diagnose and treat dehydration where present (strictly using the protocol) in the consultation with the in charge doctor.</li> <li>Provide the patient/ caretaker on importance of hygiene, the use of water and</li> <li>Explain to the caretaker her/his role as a partner in caring for the child;</li> <li>Check and encourage the stimulation and psychological support provided by mothers or those accompanying the patients;</li> <li>Encourage mothers to breast feed their children frequently and after each care administered;</li> <li>Decide on changes of phases and discharge in consultation with medical officer.</li> <li>Ensure proper referral process for cases that needs further health treatment in consultation with medical officer.</li> </ul>

Tasks & responsibilities	<ul> <li>Check that the patients who do not present a risk of hypothermia are washed and properly dried every day;</li> <li>Check that the patients and the accompanying person wash their hands before each meal and after going to the toilet;</li> <li>Check that the mats are clean, are washed and changed regularly and that blankets are available;</li> <li>Check that the clothes are washed and changed regularly;</li> <li>Check that the patient's space is washed by the accompanying person;</li> <li>Check that the water containers and utensils are clean.</li> </ul>
