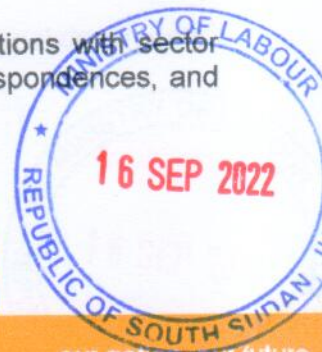
KEY ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Result 1: Quality Program Delivery (40%)

- 1.8. Contribute to the drawing of donor project budgets and work with budget holders to ensure effective operational sharing and contribute to the replication of good practices at all levels of program delivery
- 1.9. Contribute to quality thematic relevant project designs and proposal submissions for prospective partnerships
- 1.10. Ensure prompt and feasible Project Detailed Implementation Plans (DIP) for all supported projects prior to execution
- 1.11. Ensure optimal stakeholder engagement at all project delivery steps i.e. measures not limited to inceptions, AAP, joint monitoring, close-out
- 1.12. Keep track of project progresses, provide timely oversights to trainings among other forms of program delivery, and ensure timely requisitions of funds, assets, and supplies based on DIP and donor contract terms.
- 1.13. Within sector interactions, identify potential partnerships, and conduct periodic (semi-annual) program needs and country contextual analyses to inform strategic fundraising for the sector and beyond.
- 1.14. As a sector focal point, you are charged to ensure health donor relations with sector existing and prospective partnerships through quality and timely correspondences, and contributions to audit processes.

- 2.9. Identify gaps and initiate team tailored and needs based coaching and capacity support to identified teams and/or lobby for additional support where need be.
- 2.10. Foster team collaborations through tailored motivation and capacity building initiatives i.e. local rosters for coordination meeting chairs, external training if opportunities avail, etc.
- 2.11. Ensure timely management of team disputes and awareness of organizational complaints and disciplinary processes.
- 2.12. Adhere to the organization's code of conduct i.e. Ethical Codes, Child Safeguards, PSEA, Anti Fraud; and all operational policies and procedures.

- 2.13. Ensure prompt and feasible Performance Management Plans (PMP) for all supported projects prior to execution
- 2.14. Ensure timely and quality project reports (activities, expenditures, supplies) using the right tools and relevant teams are copied along

- Experiences working on children rights thematic areas is a distinct advantage

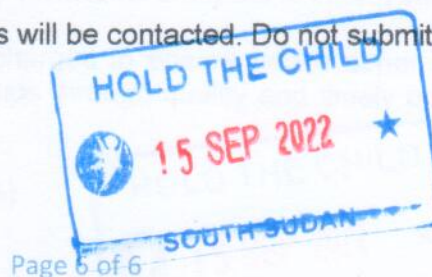
