is against this background that GIZ is inviting bids from eligible regional consulting firms to support the Republic of both Sudan in the development of its Schedule of Commitments on Trade in Services for the EAC.

The Republic of South Sudan deposited its instrument of ratification on the Accession to the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community on 5th September 2016 thereby becoming an EAC Partner State. In line with Article 4 of the EAC CMP, this obliges the Republic of South Sudan to widen and deepen cooperation with other Partner States in economic and social fields for the benefit of the EAC people. Further, in line with Article 5 of the EAC CMP, on trade in services, the Republic of South Sudan commits to 'remove measures that restrict movement of services and service suppliers, harmonise standards to ensure acceptability of services traded'. This will be implemented in accordance with its Schedule of Commitments on Trade in Services providing for the commitments made by the Republic of South Sudan in liberalization of the above mentioned 7 priority services sectors.
