I. Main Objective:

Under the guidance and direct supervision of the Programme Manager, the primary function of the GBV specialist is to ensure integration of protection principles and GBV risk mitigation mechanism to develop appropriate, focused to develop GBV tools and guideline and provide direct technical support to GBV colleagues in the field; ensure necessary training to increase capacity of the relevant team members.

II. Responsibilities/Duties:

- Map a point of service for survivors of GBV and vulnerable individuals, and identify points of entry and support structures for reinforcement
- 2. Lead assessment to identify settlements of vulnerable women and girls in the catchment areas of center-based activities
- Conduct GBV prevention and protection needs assessments among the affected populations
- 4. Analyze trends of GBV and develop / adjust program strategies to meet needs
- Develop integrated approach of activities for SRH and GBV programs for the community
- Provide technical support for the promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights in the community
- Identify and reinforce existing support mechanisms and work closely with local counterparts to ensure community-based mechanism system establish.
- Provide guidance to the development of materials for awareness-raising on the various topics related to GBV

 Support team-building and continual professional development of staff, including through regular performance appraisals





- 10. Develop and update capacity-building plan for staff and partners through conducting on-the-job supervision and assessment to evaluate key competencies and training needs
- 11. Develop GBV referral pathways along with Protection Officer in target locations by reaching out to and partner with relevant local actors
- Participate in the development of case management monitoring systems and help to ensure that GBV community workers utilize these systems correctly and consistently.
- 13. Conduct monitoring visits to project sites as necessary
- Participate in Cluster and working group meetings to ensure holistic support for survivors, including development of referral pathways
- 15. Lead assessment to identify settlements of vulnerable women and girls in the catchment areas of center-based activities
- 16. Support the development of appropriate M&E tools and the collection of data /information and share as necessary
- 17. Maintain program files and documentation as per program management minimum standards, including maintaining the confidentiality of beneficiaries' data
- 18. Maintain flexibility to take on added responsibility as and when needed
- 19. Contribute to the positive image and overall credibility of the organization
