Essential Job duties / Scope of Work:

Perform triaging, manage & treat patients at the Koch Hospital service points according to MOH & WHO treatment guidelines and participate actively in the daily ward round before opening the OPD.

- Make sure that all components of Primary Healthcare package are integrated which includes OPD, IPD, CeMONC, ANC, FP, EPI, Health Education and HIV/AIDS awareness.
- Certify and submit the weekly and monthly morbidity reports on a regularly basis.
- Develop duty roster and ensure it is followed according to the schedules
- Receive Patients refereed from Counties and PHCCs and Refer critical medical cases which cannot be managed at your level for advanced management.
- Ensure the validity and submit weekly or monthly report in time in coordination with other
- Organize and participate daily and weekly and Monthly hospital morning meetings and share meeting minutes.
- Organize, conduct meeting with Village/Payam administrators & prepare plan of action and make follow ups.
- Facilitate community-based interventions, like crash immunization and NID or during any out
- Demonstrate universal infection prevention control practices in the working places by adhering to strict measure of IPC describe in SOPs.
- Make sure that Cold Chain/Cold box is maintained properly and there is no stock out of vaccines and consumables,
- Regular conduct meetings with staff on program and report to Technical Health Officer.
- Provide daily, weekly, and monthly report and ensure recording of patients is done
- Collaboration with staff from other agencies and SMOH
- Any other task given by the supervisor to strengthen the program.

Personnel Qualifications (special training/experience required)

- Degree/Diploma in Clinical medicine or related field from a recognized institution.
- Must have more than 3-4 years of experience in managing primary health care services. International humanitarian NGO is a plus.
- High computer literacy level with expected proficiency in Word, Excel, PDF, Internet
- Ability to work independently in extreme high-risk environment with no internet or telephone communication and able to take personal initiative, and multi-task including strong facilitation skills in an ever changing and extreme environment.

- Extremely flexible and have the ability to cope with stressful situations and frustrations.
- A South Sudanese by nationality with excellent written and spoken English and Arabic language skills.
