CALL FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST PROVISION OF MEDICAL SERVICES

1st April 2020

1. Introduction:

STEWARDWOMEN is an indigenous South Sudanese women organization founded in 2009 to address the problems of sexual and gender based violence; lack of access to justice by women; lack of participation of women in leadership and decision-making and poverty among others. It is registered as a not for profit non-governmental organization with the Government of South Sudan in 2009. Our vision is a South Sudanese society “free from the violations of the human rights of women and children”. Our mission is “to develop, shape and empower South Sudanese women to advocate for policies that foster equal economic opportunity and secure human rights for women and children”.

Our 2018-2020 strategic intervention areas are; 1) Access to justice; 2) Legislation and law reform; 3) Psychosocial support to GBV survivors; 4) Protection of adolescent girls in schools; 5) Women leadership and empowerment; 6) Governance/peacebuilding; 7) Sexual and Reproductive Health rights and Economic Empowerment.

We are an organization that has been granted Observer Status by the African Commission on Human and People’s Rights. We are also a member of the Solidarity for African Women’s Rights [SOAWRS] that campaigns for the ratification and/or domestication of the Protocol to the African Charter on Human and People’s Rights on the Rights of Women in Africa [Maputo protocol]. We are also the lead agency of a national coalition of 40 CSOs that advocates for the ratification of the Maputo protocol in South Sudan. Our field offices are located in Romich in Tonj East county [Warrap state], Rubkona-Bentiu [Unity State], Magwi and Nimule [Eastern Equatoria State], and a national coordination office in Juba [Central Equatoria State].

The mission of the United Nations Trust Fund in Support of Actions to Eliminate Violence against Women is to advocate for and finance innovative approaches for preventing and ending violence against women and girls, to catalyze learning from global evidence collected from the projects it funds and to leverage its unique mandate and convening power to foster global giving for EVAW/G.¹ The UN Trust Fund carries out its activities within the framework of binding international human rights law including the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) and the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR). The Vienna Declaration and Programme of Action, the UN Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women and the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action.

With 3 years funding from UN Trust Fund, under the project title “Strengthening Provision and coordination of services to survivors of rape and early/child marriage”, and under the supervision of the Director, we are in a search of a competent “Medical Service Provider” to provide medical services to the victims of rape and early/child marriage at Jondoru and Rubkona.



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2. Purpose:

The medical service provider will be tasked with the responsibilities of providing medical services to 50 victims of rape, early/child marriages in Rubkona and Jondoru-Juba within a period of 3 years.

3. Roles of the Medical Service Provider

The specific tasks are but not limited to the followings:

- Health promotion for survivors;
- Field screening of victims of rape and early/child marriage for health risks;
- Case management as a result of rape and early/child marriage;
- Diagnosis for a possible infections as a result of rape and early/child marriage;
- Treatment of infections;
- Repair and rehabilitation of rape victims;
- Provision of health advise to the victims;
- Presentation of periodic reports to STEWARDWOMEN

3. Core Values and Competence:

Respect for women human rights and dignity; Respect for diversity; High level of integrity and self-respect deeply rooted in the South Sudanese traditions and cultures; High level of professionalism; Effective communication; Inclusive collaboration; Stakeholder engagement; Accountability; Creative problem solving and Leading by example;

4. How to Apply

The interested medical service provider is expected to provide the followings;

- Detailed company profile;
- A technical proposal with detailed response to the TOR, with specific focus on addressing the scope of work;
- Sample of previous proven works on similar assignment undertaken etc.;
- A financial proposal detailing the rates expected, and general costs, etc. and initial work plan;
- Team composition with a lead consultant, and a CV of each person to be involved in the assignment, including relevant experience.

NB: Applicants for this job must possess reputable certificates for health care service provision, high level of integrity, legally recognized and registered, based in South Sudan especially Juba. Please take note that the selection will be rigorous that will include oral and practical site checks and thorough background checks.

5. Experience & Competencies

- The lead practitioner must at least have Bachelor of Medicine, or Bachelor of Surgery, or Bachelor of Medical Sciences.
- Must be fully legally registered and practicing in South Sudan with valid legal documents.
- Must be able to perform health assessments, run diagnostic tests, prescribe medication, create treatment plans and provide health and wellness advice to patients.
- Broad experience in medical service provision especially to survivors of rape and early/child marriage;



- Experience in leading teams implementing medical service provision for vulnerable community;
- Knowledge and understanding of South Sudanese environment and culture;
- Good interpersonal skills and ability to conduct counselling to victims;
- Excellent communication skills (spoken, written and presentational);
- Must be able to travel to field sites during victim screening exercise;
- Presence of services provision in Rubkona-Unity State and Juba will be added advantage.

All interested candidates must submit the following documents as part of their proposal:

- Technical proposal (10 pages maximum) - the technical proposal should reflect how the service provider will undertake all of the tasks in the TOR.
- Detailed budget proposal
- Curriculum Vitae
- References from prior work

6. Application Procedure:

This position is open to qualified medical service providers based in South Sudan, especially Juba; if you meet the above conditions, you are asked to submit your updated company profile, legal document, including valid work permit for non-South Sudanese service providers based in South Sudan, only through our e-mail: stewardwomen.jobs@gmail.com
