#### JOB OVERVIEW

The position of MEAL Officer entails a crucial responsibility of providing support and guidance on the development, tracking and execution of the WASH, Protection and Food Security, and Livelihood Project in conjunction with other partners. The role involves assisting the program teams in devising strategies, monitoring, assessments, and evaluation plans aligned with the project proposal and programming framework.

The incumbent will be accountable for ensuring that effective monitoring systems are in place to facilitate a prompt response to the context and agile adoption of best practices by Tearfund. Moreover, the incumbent will ensure adherence to Tearfund's Quality Standards and international standards, collaborating closely with all field staff and the Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, and Learning Manager situated in the Juba Country Office. The position requires extensive travel to field sites across the operational area.

### POSITION IN THE ORGANIZATION

1. Reports to Programme Manager - for day-to-day activities in the operation area.

2. Matrix reporting to the MEAL Manager based in Juba and will Work collaboratively with other projects and support staff in the field.

3. Work with Tearfund staff and partners to monitor the quality and status of the implementation of integrated programme wide objectives articulated in the project proposal.
