- Responsible for organizing the daily work of reproductive Health in the outreach site and identify any needs or gaps & inform the medical coordinator about any problems, progress of the project.
- Participate in the weekly outreach, management meeting to communicate any issues a Extremely flexible and have the ability to cope with stressful condition.
- Must be able to take on non-medical responsibilities from time to time to cover for other team members
- Skills and knowledge in program sustainability and capacity building. public-private partnerships and project monitoring and evaluation (both quantitative and qualitative methods). Responsible for own professional development to ensure knowledge is maintained and updated suitably to fulfil this role adequately.

Personnel Qualifications (special training/experience required)

- Degree or Diploma in Midwifery, Registered Midwife from a recognized University.
- Minimum of three years of experience required, of which 1 to 2 years should be resource deprived environment.
- Previous INGO/NNGO experience
- Have an excellent communications skill, both oral and written?
- Must have excellent self-motivation skills Extremely flexible and have the ability to cope with stressful environment.
- Must speak one of the local Languages spoken in Kurwai.
- Only female midwives are strongly recommended for this position.
