ICAP at Columbia University seeks highly qualified and experienced candidates to fill the positions of **Monitoring and Evaluation Advisor** to be based in Juba, South Sudan. The position is for a period of 10 months subject to renewal on availability of funding and very good performance.

The Monitoring and Evaluation Advisor under the direct supervision of the Strategic Information Director.

- Work with ICAP SI unit head to refine M & E framework, develop data collection and reporting tools
 (if they does not exist) to track project deliverables
- Work with the Data Management Unit to improve data flow, availability and quality at all levels
- Assess project progress towards implementation of planned activities and achievement of set targets and provide report to project team for action
- Support submission of daily and weekly updates to the Public Health Emergency Operation Center Data Management Unit from supported states and facilities
- Prepare weekly, monthly, and quarterly project progress reports and share with ICAP \$1 unit
- Work with partners and UN agencies to improve the national surveillance system including review of IDSR tools, supporting technical working groups (TWGs), etc.
- Lead design and implementation of baseline, mid-line and end-line/final evaluation of project activities
- Provide technical assistance/training for state and county surveillance officers to improve data availability and quality towards the national system
- Conduct regular data quality review and cleaning across various supported COVID-19 pillars and provide feedback to the pillars
- Support rollout of the MOH COVID-19 modules in DHIS2 especially to non-PEPFAR supported sites
- Work with state and facility level ICAP SI team members as well as other partners to leverage resources and improve reporting rates
- Attend TWG meetings including data management TWG
- Carry out other M&E duties as assigned

- Master's degree in the any of the above fields is preferred
- Experience in surveillance and surveys preferred.
