**AIM OF THE POSITION**

Nutrition in detention Field Officer contributes to implementing, running and monitoring the nutrition programmes, in cooperation with the healthcare in detention (HCD), according to the objectives set out in the delegation's annual planning (Planning for Results) for a specific geographic area or field of activities.

**Main Duties and Responsibilities:**

**Nutrition in Detention**

- Participates in and supports prison clinic staff in monitoring closely nutrition activities;
- Monitors MAM and SAM registers and stock cards filled in by prison staff and ensures that all the information recorded are accurate and up-to-date;
- Follows-up on admission/discharge of MAM and SAM and micronutrient deficiencies patients in the program on a weekly basis;
- Collects and enters into the database nutrition program data (admissions and discharges) on a weekly basis;
- Ensures that EcoSec and health (in close relation to Health FO) investigation is carried out for non-respondent cases to the treatment.
- Monitors stocks level and consumption of food and nutrition products (PPN, PPS, BP5, Supercereal, etc) on a weekly basis;
- Actively participates in the assessment and monitoring of the food chain: procurement/food supply and production, food storage, food transformation/preparation, food distribution and food consumption;
- Actively coaches the prison staff involved in the food chain on the use of stock management and monitoring tools, cooking methods, adequate food distribution, monitoring of nutritional value of rations.
- Calculates and monitors the penitentiary ration on a weekly basis;

- Participates in the planning and organization including data collection of BMI activities on a quarterly basis, and participates in the analysis of malnutrition causes in the prison;
- Refers to the nutrition checklist at every visit.
- Actively use and refer to the Nutrition checklist on TeamSpace: printing the page before each visit and ticking all tasks achieved.
- Provides feedbacks to local authorities about the nutrition situation in the place of detention.

**Minimum required knowledge & experience:**

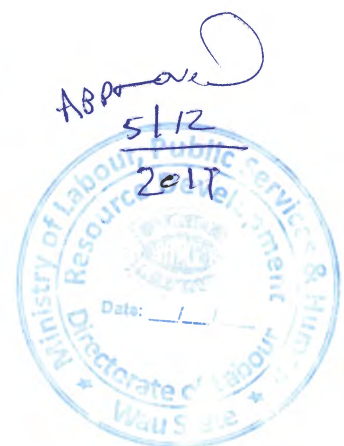
- 3 - 5 years working experience;
- Experience in nutrition;
- Advanced conversational and written in English and Dinka (Arabic an asset);
- Expert level in computer skills (word, excel, e-mail, internet);
- Skilled or capacity to develop skills in the following competencies: representing the ICRC, networking and communication, adapting and learning, responsibility and autonomy, communication (ability to express views and ideas), analysis and synthesis;
- Good knowledge of ICRC mandate, IHL, and of other humanitarian topics;
- Good knowledge of geographically assigned environment;
- Readiness to spend 50 - 75% of the time in the field, including in prisons;
- Driving license is an asset.
