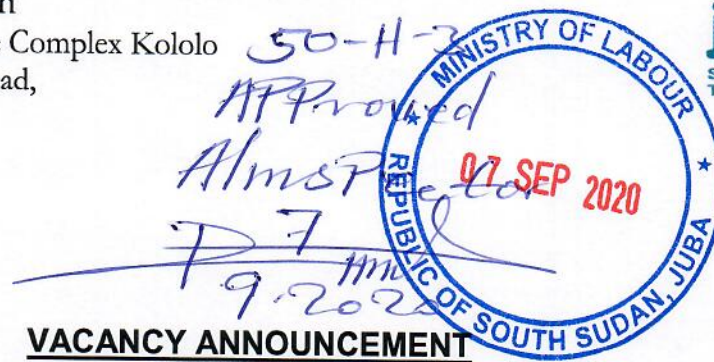

BACKGROUND

The Strengthening the Provision of Primary Health Care Services for HIV (SPPHC-HIV) project is a 5-year HIV Care and Treatment mechanism, implemented by Jhpiego since 2015. In COP20, starting from 1 October 2020, the SPPHC project will also implement activities to ensure that **Key Populations (KP)** and Priority Populations (PP) in South Sudan are reached with essential and life-saving HIV prevention, testing, care and treatment services, as well as post-GBV clinical response.

Jhpiego will implement KP programming for clients in located in six counties. The project will provide increased access to quality HIV prevention, treatment, care, and support services to key populations and their clients. In COP20, interventions will target Key Populations (specifically Female Sex Workers (FSWs), including brothel based FSWS) and Priority Populations (specifically clients of FSWS, vulnerable Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW)) in Juba, Nimule, Yambio, Wau, Bor, and Rumbek.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Outreach Coordinator will be responsible for the overall implementation of the JHPIEGO HIV activities at county level. The Outreach Coordinator will work collaboratively with the project staff and with country level leadership to design and

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implement proven HIV Prevention care and treatment approaches with the Key Populations through, identification of Key Population who might be hard to reach, hidden and are either at high risk of HIV infection or living with HIV and not accessing care and treatment services. Expand community level interventions to increase provider and end user uptake of comprehensive HIV services. He/she will be responsible for the project data at site of implementation. He will formulate project objectives and develop strategies for their achievement using evidence-based theories and methodologies, in close collaboration with SMOH. He will be based in at county level and also plan, coordinate and supervise outreach activities in the county level. In collaboration of the state/County Health Leadership and be responsible for mobilization of peer educators to carry out target group sensitization on HIV preventive measures, promote targeted HIV Counseling and Testing services, condom use, and ensure all clients identified HIV positive are successfully referred and initiated ART at the link facilities. S/he will commit 100% of his/her time on the JHPIEGO HIV activities Project. (Multiple positions)

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Maps and estimates the size of the Key population at County level
- Coordinates and collaborates the Key population HIV activities with the State/County Leadership
- Plans, coordinates and mobilizes peer Education and outreach HIV interventions with the Key Population
- Develop and implement work plans and programs to improve the outreach to targeted communities of sex workers
- Coordinates planned comprehensive HTS activities with partner link facilities for project ownership and sustainability
- Initiate HIV testing and prevention intervention to Clients of the Female Sex workers
- Ensure that all the data reporting tools are in place and used by project staffs in line with SOPs
- Receive hard copies of data from teams and enter the FSW data into the data reporting templates of the project
- Ensure safety of all the FSW related data both in hard and soft copies



- Provide project progress of activities on weekly levels and shares compiled monthly data with Juba team on time
- Mentors and supervises the peer educators and peer navigators
- Leads and contributes to the planning, design and implementation of behavior change interventions at community level
- Provide creativity and energy to SBCC efforts within the project goals
- Engage and oversee the dissemination of materials and messages on HIV prevention, care and treatment to Key population
- Remains informed on state-of-the art HIV prevention, care and treatment programs for sex workers
- Oversees and provides technical support toward the process of documentation of best practices
- Work collaboratively with other project team members to ensure necessary program planning and implementation activities functions smoothly and efficiently
- Contribute to timely and appropriate reporting

EDUCATION/EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

- Diploma in Health services and or Bachelor's degree in a relevant field
- A minimum of 3 years of mid to senior level experience in designing, implementing, and evaluating Outreach interventions or managing large, complex facility and/or community based HIV/AIDS projects for developing countries.
- Expertise in developing and implementing HIV/AIDS programs, especially those related to HTS, prevention and care interventions, and referral and supervision systems
- Previous experience on donor-supported programs, with significant knowledge of the South Sudan health sector at all levels of the system.
- Experience working with the Key Populations (Female Sex Workers) would be an added advantage




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- Strong communication, negotiation, and presentation skills
- Proficient IT skills: Microsoft Word, Excel, Power point
- Proven leadership and supervisory experience in leading teams to successful outcomes
- Strong verbal and written English. Juba Arabic language skills desirable.
