





A CALL FOR JOURNALISTS TRAINING IN BUDGET REPORTING – JUBA

The Institute of Social Policy and Research (ISPR) is a registered non-governmental, non-profit public policy and research Centre (RRC Registration No 1122) that implements social, economic and governance policy research and conducts governance trainings and management consultancy for civil society groups, the public and private sectors.

ISPR together with Okay Africa Foundation (OAF) and Community Empowerment for Rehabilitation and Development (CEFoRD) have received funding for the training of only 10 indigenous South Sudanese journalists both male and female from **Juba** in reporting on the National Budget Process.

The training is intended to help the journalists appreciate the different dimensions and aspects of a National Budget in order to help them report it objectively and comprehensively.

The training will be carried out in the coming weeks by experienced international media trainers. It will be executed via Zoom and will be for Print, Radio, Television and Online media practitioners.

It will be carried out over a period of three days. There are very limited places for eligible, practicing journalists.
