2. Country and Organizational Context

Following the confirmation of the initial COVID-19 and BHI activities from March 2021 to March 2022 that included the Design and dissemination of training manuals for Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE) and surveillance, there is need to incorporate BHI activities to COVID -19 response. The national consultant will be tasked with the review and updating the BHI training manual/tools to incorporate COVID-19 response and vaccination activities in the guidelines.

The development of the guidelines for BHI and COVID-19 was identified as critical and a coordination structure that includes the COVID-19 National Steering Committee Chaired by the D/G has been established. This was followed by establishment of service cluster for overall policy and strategic guidance; National Steering Committee and its eight Technical Working Groups, chaired by the COVID-19 Incident Manager for providing strategic and operational guidance; and the COVID-19 state Taskforce committees for coordinating the frontline implementation of recommended COVID-19 interventions.

Coordination and establishment of technical working group (TWG) has been effective given the existing BHI preparedness structures, the partner mapping; effective leadership from the MoH and the trainings undertaken, thus leading to harmonisation of risk communication approaches and messages – considered to be one of the critical pillars of COVID-19 emergency preparedness and response.

In March 2022, an intra-action review (IAR) was undertaken to assess the capacity of the public health and emergency response systems and to identify practical areas for immediate remediation or continued improvement of the current response to the COVID-19 outbreak. The findings from the National

consultant indicated that there was robust mobilization of partners to support RCCE facilitated by presence of humanitarian partners countrywide; there was some level of engagement of community leaders /influencers; there was use of mix communication channels for dissemination of COVID-19 messages; and there was an evidence base- a guideline study that allowed targeted messaging. Key challenges were also teased out: limited systematic community engagement; progressive decrease of risk perception; limited enforcement of the recommended measures to support risk communication messages; and demand versus services imbalance due to weak coordination.

The Ministry of Health in collaboration with partners has developed several guiding documents to support the RCCE activities in the country. Standard operating procedures (SOP) for RCCE TWG; Communication Strategy for COVAX; Key Messages on COVID vaccination (updated on March to the end of year 2022) were some of of them. However, the existing national Health Promotion and RCCE documents need to be revised, the lessons learned thus far consolidated, and the national guideline and RCCE strategy developed in the context COVID-19. A national consultant to lead this exercise is, therefore, required.

Purpose of the Assignment

The main objective of this consultancy is to review the existing Boma Health Initiative Strategy in the context of COVID-19 pandemic and support the development of BCC Strategy. The specific objectives are:

- Review and update the BHTs training manual to incorporate covid-19 response and the ongoing vaccination efforts. The Boma Health Initiative Strategy was developed in (2018-2023) before the COVID-19 pandemic. (The soft copy is available)
- To support the development of BHI COVID-19 Strategy including the vaccination efforts and developed a ToR for the training.
- Support the development of BHI and RCCE Supportive Supervision checklist

Specific Tasks

The consultant will carry out the following tasks:

- Assess and revise the existing BHI strategy (2018-2023) and RCCE TWG plan and SOP to address the current risk communication and behavioral change needs
- Support the development of behavioral change communications (BCC) Strategy
- Guide the development and implementation of BCC that is gender and culturally sensitive communication and social mobilization plans
- Advice on how to integrate COVID-19 messaging into the response and the health promotion to other ongoing emergencies like COVID-19 vaccination, floods; polio; measles and other public health threats
- Design and disseminate Boma Health Initiative and COVID-19 strategy for targeted messages: (i) to combat mis-information, Disinformation, stigma and negative social norms through mix channels (ii) to protect the most vulnerable
- Design a strategy for identification and engagement of community leaders/influencers

Deliverables

Output (1): Review and update the existing BHTs training manual/tools in COVID-19 response

- -Deliverable 1.1: Conduct Desk review of existing health promotion strategy and other strategic and relevant documents including but not limited to; National RCCE strategy, National Health Emergency Response Plan, Health Emergency and Disaster Risk Management Strategy, Country's National Health Sector Policy for Disaster Mitigation, National Strategic Preparedness and Response Plan for COVID-19, and other various response plans/documents on COVID, COVAX and produce a report.
- -Deliverable 1.2: Plan and prepare a one-day consultative workshop with the relevant stakeholders involved in risk communication in order to update the BHTs training manual/Tools
 - Moderation of the workshop.
 - Documentation of the results and produce a report
- -Deliverable 1.3: Update the draft of the BHTs Training manual/Tools with COVID -19 incorporated
- -Deliverable 1.4: A finalized and endorsed BHTs training manual and other related Tools
