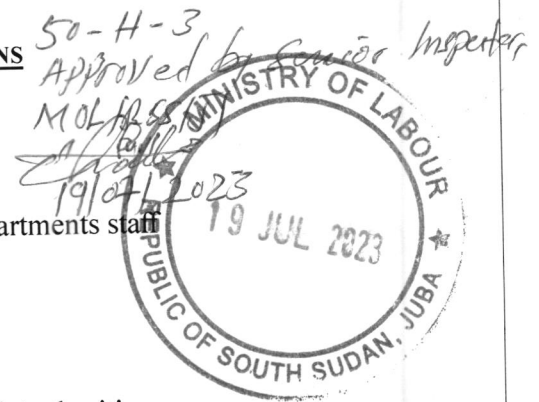

Background

HI has been operating in South Sudan since 2006, implementing humanitarian and development actions aimed at promoting the rights, safety and quality of life of vulnerable populations, particularly persons with disabilities, mental health problems and functional limitations across the country. HI's current portfolio adopts an integrated and multi-sectoral approach which includes interventions centred on MHPSS, Protection, Functional Rehabilitation and livelihoods with disability inclusion a cross-cutting theme across all



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programmes. In 2021, HI will continue to implement interventions in these areas, whilst transitioning to post-emergency and recovery programming.

Mission 1: Operational implementation

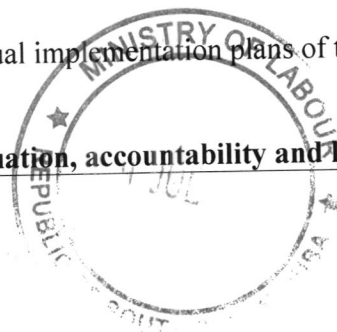
Responsibility 1: Contribute to project planning and technical implementation in line with the existing MHPSS frameworks

- Contribute to planning and preparing activities, MHPSS tools and the associated resources, and implement the action plan in conjunction with the support services and the technical unit.
- Ensure that activities are implemented and that resources are correctly allocated as authorized by the project manager.
- Ensure regular reporting of activities, and contribute to the internal and external reporting as requested by the project manager.
- Contribute to identifying areas of the project in which adjustments are required and put forward adaptations to the project manager.
- Contribute to the drafting of amendment requests when asked by the project manager.
- Contribute to coordination with the local stakeholders and to monitoring the partnership relationship with the project partners.
- Ensure that project documents and information are properly archived.
- Provide technical support supervision, coaching and mentorship for PSS workers and counsellors at field level

Responsibility 2: Carry out MHPSS capacity building initiatives and needs analysis for HI staff and partners

- Contribute to needs assessments to develop staff capacity building initiatives/ plan in collaboration with Technical specialist.
- Plan and Implement capacity building trainings in coordination with the Technical Specialist and project manager
- Conduct in-services, workshops and staff development programs in all project locations.
- Regularly support the Technical Specialist in evaluating the MHPSS technical components of activities implemented through partners
- Participate in drawing up strategies and/or the annual implementation plans of the project.

Responsibility 3: Contribute to project monitoring, evaluation, accountability and learning



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- Contribute to project monitoring, specifically activity progress indicators and the expected outcomes.
- Contribute to project evaluations, project reviews at the request of the project manager, and ensure that project evaluation recommendations are followed.
- Contribute to project learning and documentation of good practices

Mission 2: Emergency Preparedness and Response

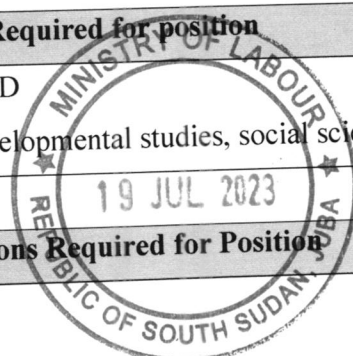
