



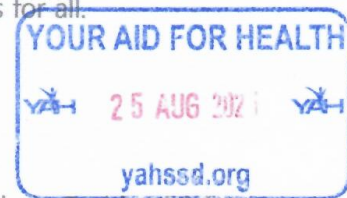

The project integrates clinical expertise, community engagement, and youth-centered care to develop scalable mental health solutions.

The Psychiatric Nurse will play a vital role in supporting clinical activities, mentoring community health workers, and contributing to holistic care planning for young people.

### **Role Purpose**

The Psychiatric Nurse will provide clinical support across project sites, contributing to assessments, medication monitoring (where applicable), and care coordination. The role also involves capacity-building for frontline workers and active participation in multidisciplinary case reviews.

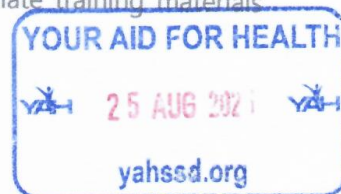
### **Key Responsibilities**

#### **1. Clinical Support & Monitoring**

- Assist in conducting psychiatric assessments and follow-up evaluations.
- Monitor medication adherence, side effects, and treatment responses in collaboration with prescribing clinicians.
- Provide psychoeducation to patients and families on mental health conditions and treatment plans.

#### **2. Training & Supervision**

- Support the training of community health workers in basic mental health care, psychosocial support, and referral protocols.
- Supervise and mentor community-based staff to ensure quality and consistency in service delivery.
- Contribute to the development of culturally appropriate training materials and guidelines.



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### 3. Care Coordination & Case Reviews

- Participate in multidisciplinary case review meetings to inform care planning and decision-making.
- Liaise with social workers, psychologists, and other team members to ensure integrated care.
- Facilitate referrals to specialized services when needed and follow up on outcomes.

### 4. Documentation & Reporting

- Maintain accurate clinical records and contribute to project data collection and reporting.
- Document training activities, supervision visits, and patient outcomes.
- Support the preparation of reports for internal and external stakeholders.

### 5. Community Engagement & Advocacy

- Promote mental health awareness and stigma reduction in collaboration with youth and community partners.
- Advocate for patient-centered care and ethical practices in all project activities.

### Required Qualifications

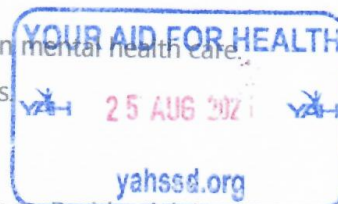
- Bachelor's degree in Nursing with specialization in Psychiatry or Mental Health Nursing.
