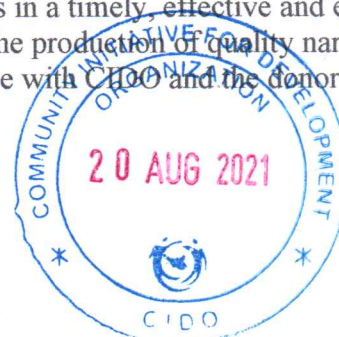

CIDO implements Protection, Women Rights and Empowerment, Education, Human Rights, Health and Nutrition Projects.

CIDO is looking for suitable candidates to fill the positions of Emergency response officers to be based in Akobo East.

Job overview

The ERO will work closely with other protection partners in Akobo East. The ERO officer will Supervise and guide the full implementation, management, coordination and achievement of expected outcomes of CIDO Humanitarian response Project in Akobo East; In this capacity, the officers will be responsible for day-to-day supervision and oversight of the casuall and various S/NFI activities, budget management, administration, and implementation of the requirements of the programs. She or He will implement CIDOs activities in a timely, effective and efficient manner; the successful candidate will also participate in the production of quality narratives in coordination with the management staff and in compliance with CIDO and the donor's expectations.

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Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- Conduct assessments in collaboration with other NGOs
- Ensure beneficiaries of S/NFI receive appropriate assistance including referral to other services
- Supervise the emergency response team (crowd controllers, enumerators and translators)
- Ensure S/NFI supplies are safe and distributed to the right beneficiaries
- Communicate community needs to your supervisors
- Ensure Complaint and feedback mechanisms is followed by the beneficiaries
- Compile reports and share with your supervisor
- Perform any other duty assigned by the supervisor

Required Professional and Technical Skills:

- Bachelors degree in Social work or Community development studies
- Minimum of three years of professional experience in emergency programming including IASC guidelines.
- Strong understanding of protection principles and likely protection concerns arising in the South Sudan context affecting children and women as well as conflict sensitivity
- Solid experience in staff management in a cross-cultural environment required
- Demonstrated training and facilitation experience
- Experience in complex emergencies and the ability to live and work in a very remote environment
- Ability to work under pressure and without daily supervision
- Demonstrated analytical skills and report writing experience required
- Strong interpersonal, intercultural and communication skills
- Excellent oral and written skills and computer skills.
