ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Rooted in Trust project works to combat COVID-19 rumors and misinformation in Afghanistan, Lebanon, Iraq, Colombia, Brazil, Mali, DRC, South Sudan, Sudan and Zimbabwe. We work to create impact at the local level and inform approaches to rumor management at the global level. The project is supported by a Global Technical Advisory team made up of media, humanitarian, data science and information management experts. In Phase 1 of the project, we collected more than 19,000 rumors in 14 languages and supported more than 30 local trusted information providers. In this critical phase of the pandemic, we will build on these efforts to listen and respond to the information challenges faced by vulnerable groups in humanitarian contexts, encouraging open dialogue between citizens and scientists and stronger and more collaborative partnerships between information providers (such as local media) and humanitarian and health sources.

ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITY

The Assistant Researcher will support the researcher manage the implementation of an Information Ecosystem Assessment (IEA) in South Sudan. The Assistant Researcher will have a strong focus on how vulnerable and marginalized groups communicate to access information about COVID-19 related issues and how their use of online media intersects with their use of traditional media and other sources. Research activities will include desk research, social media monitoring, Key Informant Interviews, Focus Group Discussions, surveys, capacity assessment interviews and field observations. The Report will help to inform public health and humanitarian response agencies to better communicate key messages to the at-risk population.

The ideal candidate is office-based at Internews office, Juba South Sudan. The research assistant will travel as required to study location to facilitate and supervise the IEA research activities.

- Work with the researcher to design the research activities; develop the research plan, sampling framework & strategy

- Support the researcher and partner organizations in planning and organizing data collectors training
- Negotiate the research plan with partners and selection of partners field team for training & data collection process
- Establish a local research advisory committee each study location to ensure direct engagement with the target community & influential leaders
- Facilitate the availability of logistics, supplies, research refreshments, relevant consent forms, recorder for interviews, printed forms, etc.
- Organize focus group discussions and key informant interviews; interview of community members, influential and NGO staff and provide detailed notes
- Undertake supervision of the data collection process to ensure quality data collection practices;
- Develop a code book with support of the researcher Codes the transcripts based on the code book
- Work with the researcher to Identify information flows, uses, popular platforms, trusted actors, and how information on the virus is produced, distributed and accessed;
- Undertake daily debriefings with the Researcher, make detailed notes based on debriefing with Researcher, and where necessary complements such notes with transcriptions and interviews
- Ensure that all Files and all research materials are properly compiled and stored on Egnyte
- Support the researcher in the development of the research report, in generating graphs or other engaging content to display data;
- Support the researcher in planning and organizing dissemination workshops including delivering research findings back to the target community through events or resources

- Strong understanding of the humanitarian principles to ensure data collection and provision follows the Core Humanitarian Standards;
- Relevant experience working with data collection and analysis software, including Kobo Toolbox or similar software;
