## PROJECT INFORMATION

The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) funded Resilience through Agriculture in South Sudan Activity (RASS Project) is a four-year activity led by prime Contractor, DAI Global, LLC. and three partners: CARE International, International Fertilizer Development Center (IFDC), and The Waterfield Design Group, Inc. (WDG). The RASS Project's objective is to improve food security and community household recovery and resilience in up to 17 counties in Western Bahr El Ghazal, Unity, Upper Nile, Jonglei, Western Equatoria, Lakes, and Eastern Equatoria States in line with USAID strategic partnership framework with the Republic of South Sudan. To achieve this goal, RASS Project, working with partners, employs a "resilience pathways" approach to achieve three objectives: improve the effectiveness of local systems and strengthen capacities to sustain gender-responsive, diversified, and market-sensitive agricultural production; increase the availability of, access to, and use of diverse, safe, and affordable diets; and expand opportunities for sustainable, locally driven livelihoods.

#### **ACTIVITY BACKGROUND**

South Sudan's rural areas are generally remote, with poor infrastructure, limited health and education services, weak institutions, lack of opportunity, and a nascent private sector. Largely outside the formal economy, livelihoods are resource-based and often insufficient to enable households to sustain and recover from reoccurring shocks and stresses and break out of poverty. According to the Integrated Phase Classification (IPC) scale, most of South Sudan is in a state of acute food insecurity (phase 3), or worse, in a food emergency (phase 4), indicating severe levels of acute and chronic malnutrition.

To contribute toward the improvement of the situation, USAID issued the RASS Activity, whose overall goal is to transition communities from humanitarian assistance to inclusive development assistance and economic growth. As part of RASS' start-up foundational activities, RASS facilitated Juba and county-level inception workshops in collaboration with existing USAID implementing partners, other donor activities, and the four corners of the local community traditional authorities, civil society (including faith-based organizations and women and youth groups), the private sector, and local government to, among others, identify root causes of recurrent crisis in target counties, and define the initial set of activities to be implemented. Infrastructure development was identified as key to achieving its objectives. RASS Activity is therefore involved in storage, market, warehousing, water, and livelihood construction to support improved productivity, enhance access to high quality nutritious foods, and promote alternative livelihoods to agriculture. To achieve this, RASS Activity requires the services of an Infrastructure Technical Consultant to assist in designing, reviewing designs, and supervise construction of the various infrastructure in accordance with USAID and the Government of South Sudan rules and regulations.

#### POSITION DESCRIPTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Infrastructure Technical Assistant shall be stationed in the construction project sites and work to facilitate RASS management in undertaking construction site supervision, construction quality control and quality assurance services. Working under the direct supervision of the infrastructure manager, the Infrastructure Technical Assistant shall;



- Carry out day to day construction supervision on the assigned RASS construction project sites
- Inspect construction materials and verify materials and tools, and workmanship follow the technical specifications.
- Produce weekly construction progress reports
- Monitor and control construction operations and bring issues of noncompliance to the attention of the Infrastructure Manager.
- Check that the infrastructure adheres to scope, time and budget according to the infrastructure guidelines, standard operating procedures.
- Fill correctly the construction quality control and quality assurance forms.
- Ensure that Health & Safety, security and Environmental management plans are followed with the expected attention.
- Abide by the principal of respectful work environment free from harassment and retaliation and the prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse.
- Support site visits by an approved site inspector on regular basis for inspection of quality of construction and site progress. Detailed report is required to be submitted for each site visit.
- Perform sampling of construction material at site and conduct quality control test through approved means such as laboratories and submit the report to RASS
- Conduct any other technical responsibility delegated by the management.
