



**JOB VACANCY: Civil Engineer for road construction/rehabilitation through community intervention
(1 position)**

AVSI Foundation is a global non-governmental organization with headquarters in Italy. Its mission is to support human development in developing countries according to the social teaching of the Catholic Church: recognizing the uniqueness of each person, who as such cannot be reduced to a number within an anonymous category such as "the poor, the sick, and the disabled". Furthermore, every person and every community represent a resource, regardless of their vulnerability. This is why AVSI works to help people in becoming aware of their own value and dignity. AVSI is operating in South Sudan since 2005, implementing medium to long-term sustainable health, education, water & sanitation, food security and emergency relief programmes.

The organisation is now seeking to recruit suitable qualified **national or international staff** for the position of **Civil Engineer**.

Duty Station: Based in Kauto Payam, with duty station in Nanyangachor/Nachodokopele bomas (80%) and in Kapoeta Town (20%), Kapoeta South and East Counties, Eastern Equatoria State

Job Roles:

The Civil Engineer ensures that will be the focal person for hardware interventions, especially in the road rehabilitations through community intervention and involvement of community members through FFA project funded by WFP.

Specific Tasks and Responsibilities:

ENGINEER PROGRAMMING

- The main work consists in the rehabilitation of roads through community involvement. The specific focus will be in two main locations:
 - Rehabilitation of Kangeleng-Namolokonyit road (9km) in the remote Kauto Payam in Kapoeta East;
 - Construction of bridge in Lotom river, along Narus-Nachodokopele road;
- Perform technical assessments and prepare Bills of Quantities (BOQs), general Specifications and Drawings for construction of civil infrastructures (bridges, drainage systems, etc) and school facilities;
- Develop detailed construction plans to ensure that the implementation of the project construction works is carried out in the most effective and expeditious manner;
- Assist the programme support units in the preparation of the tender documents (ITB) and undertake the technical evaluation and participate in the tender evaluations;
- Supervise, monitor and provide technical inputs on the construction and rehabilitation works in progress,
- Submit a progress report after the completion of each field visit or as required by the Project Manager
- Perform the technical acceptance procedures on completed works in coordination with the contracted construction firm.
- Perform any other project related duties as requested by the Project Manager/Area Team leader

- Collaborating and coordinating with the government, NGOs, and UN agencies on Infrastructure issues.
- Participating in State and National level Cluster meetings and other relevant humanitarian coordination meetings.
- Ensuring that all relevant stakeholders have information about the organization's background, program, objectives, working areas, duration of programs and activities in the field
- Promoting and reinforcing relationships with National technical authorities in infrastructure related intervention.

Qualification and skills required:

- Degree/ Masters in Civil Engineering, or specializations;
- 6-10 Years experiences in road rehabilitation and implementing humanitarian programs;
- Excellent written and oral English skills required; Knowledge of Toposa Language is an asset;
- Computer literacy (good command of excel and word), being familiar with Auto Cad Software is a plus;
- Motorbike driving skills;
- Must be able to work independently, with minimum supervision;
- Clarification on the context: the location of intervention is extremely remote, with no access to network and extremely limited accessibility during rainy season. The candidate must prove its capacity to manage to work in this kind of locations during the interview.

Applications should include updated nonrefundable **Curriculum Vitae (CV)**, National **ID** and **cover letter**. In the cover letter (of no more than two pages in length) the candidate should briefly describe his or her motivation for the position and highlight relevant experience.
