Purpose of the job.

The Gender Equality Specialist will be responsible for direct implementation of gender related activities in GASWASH gender strategy. S/he will identify and build capacity of women led organizations in the state on gender equality and gender mainstreaming in WASH. The GE Specialist will be responsible for rolling out gender transformative approaches including CARE's SAA (Social Analysis and Action) and EMAP approaches with the community groups as well as coordinate savings groups and WASH community groups under the leadership of the Gender advisor

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

I. IMPLEMENTATION OF WORKPLAN

- Develop and implement monthly workplans according to the project implementation plan
- Provide technical guidance on gender mainstreaming to WASH project officers and WASH community groups
- Mobilize and conduct discussions with community groups on negative socio-cultural norms using SAA and EMAP
- Provide technical guidance to women led organizations on gender equality and diversity and gender mainstreaming n WASH
- Mobilize and provide technical guidance to savings groups using CARE's VSLA approach

2. CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT

- Build capacity of WASH stakeholders on gender equality
- Conduct gender responsive trainings to WUCs, HF staff
- Develop WASH business training programs for female participants in WASH programs
- Mobilize and train local leaders on gender equality and GBV prevention
- Facilitate Community Score Cards with communities
- Conduct trainings and dialogue sessions on gender to community groups using SAA, SASA and EMAP



3. M and E and Reporting

- Develop IEC materials based on communication needs and learning from the project
- Document the process, challenges, lessons learnt and best practices for improvements of project interventions
- Actively participate in drafting activity weekly, monthly, quarterly and reports as required in a timely
- Monitor and track utilization of program supplies and resources to ensure efficient use of available resources.
- Facilitate and Participate in both partner and consultants M&E activities.
- Ensure tracking of key program indicators and progress through utilization of the M&E data collection and indicator tracking tools are being followed by volunteers and other stakeholders like WROs
- Facilitate Community Score cards with community groups
- Engage stakeholders during quarterly and annual project reviews.
