Purpose of the Role

The Nutrition programme coordinator supports the food assistance & Nutrition projects in recruiting staffs, reviewing reports, facilitating and following up issues at country office (like procurements, items to be collected and dispatched from WFP), representing the nutrition program in cluster meetings and supporting in collecting important information for proposal development. S/he also participates in providing capacity building of Field Offices Nutrition Staff. S/he supports all nutrition projects in Lakes and other states of possible expansion.

Roles and Responsibilities

- Responsible for reviewing donor reports and give feedback/correction to project team
- Represent PI in Nutrition cluster and other meetings when delegated by supervisor

- The post holder is expected to actively participate and contribute to the development of annual plans and budgets.
- Conduct supervisory visits to the nutrition centers to ensure nutrition interventions are implemented according to the national CMAM/MIYCN guidelines.
- Monitor CMAM program in different counties, nutrition sites and program categories using SPHERE standard indicators
- Liaise with country office support functions to facilitate procurement, staff recruitment, transfer of items procured and any supplies collected from UNICEF, WFP and WHO
- Participate in the recruitment of nutrition staff to different projects
- Participate in technical and strategic discussions and meetings concerning emergency nutrition response in South Sudan
- Liaise with the nutrition officers to ensure OTP, SFP, SC interventions and community mobilization activities are followed according to protocols as well as national and international guidelines.
- · Assist with other related tasks as required.
- The Nutrition Program Coordinator should be willing to re-locate and work to any other Plan international Project location
