Background information

MI has been actively engaged in today's geographic area of South Sudan since 1996. Our current programming focuses on Central Equatoria and Western Bahr el Ghazal States. The main thematic sectors are Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH), Food & Nutrition Security / Livelihoods (FNSL), Health & Wellbeing, and peacebuilding and strengthening social cohesion. MI aims to implement its projects in accordance with the Humanitarian Development Peace (HDP) Nexus for a sustainable impact of our interventions. To continue our engagement in peacebuilding and contribute to a culture of peaceful coexistence in Yei County, MI seeks to engage a Peace Assistant for school mobilisation to support peaceful conflict resolution between warring individuals.

Through its transitional development assistance project, MI provides assistance to vulnerable populations in Yei County, incl. internally displaced persons (IDPs), refugees, returnees, and host communities. The project covers multiple sectors, incl. food security, nutrition, livelihood support, Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH), mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS), and peacebuilding. As part of the peacebuilding component of the project, MI supports peace education in primary schools in Yei River County. In the previous projects cycle, peace clubs were established in four primary schools and students educated on conflict resolution strategies. In order to continue these activities under the project's peace component, MI is looking for a Peace Assistant who will ensure the continued existence and functioning of peace clubs and the integration of peace education in the curriculum.



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Core responsibilities

- Train and support peace clubs in four primary schools, incl. work plan development and implementation, organisation of peace events, administrative issues and self-organisation, such as management of membership, holding meetings and preparing meeting minutes, etc.
- Organise social events on peace topics at primary schools in collaboration with peace clubs
- Develop and conduct peace education programmes incl. conflict resolution strategies for the target audience
- Develop and conduct trainings for teaching personnel on the contents and methodology of peace education and support them in integrating it in the curriculum, in line with national education policies
- Sensitise teaching personnel and school administration on the importance of peace education in the curriculum and liaise with them to ensure sustainability of activities after the end of the project
- Conduct weekly visits to each of the four schools to support and build a relationship of mutual understanding and trust with students, teaching personnel, and school administration
- Regularly (at least monthly) provide a report detailing the progress of activities at the four primary schools
- Consult with the peacebuilding and project management teams to coordinate different peace activities and improve the peace education in schools under the peacebuilding project component
- Other tasks as required

Qualifications

The ideal candidate should possess the following profile:

- At least two years of experience in peace education, ideally in the context of primary schools
- Excellent communication skills, cultural sensitivity, and demonstrated ability to work with children of primary school age
- Knowledge of the South Sudanese education system, incl. national education policies, and national and international instruments on peace education
- Proficient use of common computer software (esp. MS Word, Outlook, Teams, Excel)
- Fluency in English and one of the following languages is required: (Juba) Arabic, Bari (or dialects thereof), Kaliko. Other languages are considered an additional asset.
