Overview:

Women for Women International works in some of the most dangerous places to be a woman. We serve women survivors of war in conflict and post-conflict areas around the world including Afghanistan, Iraq, DR Congo, Nigeria, Rwanda, and South Sudan. Our core belief is that stronger women build stronger nations; and with access to knowledge, resources, and a support network, a woman rebuilds her life and improves her community.

Women for Women International began working in South Sudan in 2006, first in Rumbek, Lake State, and since 2013 in Yei, Central Equatoria. More than 14,000 marginalized women have graduated from 12-month signature program of social and economic empowerment.

Following a 2-years suspension of program activities in 2017-2018 due to heightened levels of insecurity across Yei River County, we reestablished our presence and programming in Yei in 2019 and have designed an ambitious strategic plan for expanding our work impact, both directly and through local partners, for the coming years.

Women for Women International is embarked on a new action-oriented research project: "Putting Survivors at the Centre: Creating new programming models for non-Gender Based Violence (GBV) specialist organizations to support GBV survivors", which aims to develop programming models that equip non-GBV specialists to receive disclosures from GBV survivors, meet survivors' basic and immediate needs, and facilitate access between GBV survivors and response services in South Sudan.

Purpose.

Women for Women International has embarked on an action-oriented research project titled "Putting Survivors at the Centre: Creating New Programming Models for Non-Gender-Based Violence (GBV) Specialist Organizations to Support GBV Survivors." This project aims to develop programming models that enable non-GBV specialists to effectively support GBV survivors by receiving disclosures, meeting immediate needs, and facilitating access to response services in South Sudan

Objectives:

The overall objective of the Filming and video production consultancy is to carryout video production, editing and final video produced for awareness raising on GBV by WfWI from the script being developed for educating WfWI beneficiaries/masses.

Scope of Work for Video Filming and Production Consultant:

1. Collaborate with project stakeholders to understand the objectives and messaging requirements for video content.
2. The ability to collaborate effectively with project stakeholders and survivors to ensure their voices are accurately represented in the video content.
3. Develop creative concepts and storyboards for video production that align with the project's goals.

4. Conduct filming sessions with actors re-telling stories of GBV in a respectful and empowering manner.
5. Edit the footage to create engaging and impactful video content that amplifies the experiences of survivors.
6. Incorporate feedback from stakeholders to refine the final video products.

Deliverables:

- Produce three (03) high-quality video clips that effectively communicate the experiences and stories of GBV survivors (re-created by actors) in not less than 10 min
- Ensure produced videos have subtitles in English
- Edited videos of one hour which is suitable for distribution on various platforms to raise awareness and advocate for positive change.
- Covert the produced videos into audio format.
- Share the images/photo
- Share the trailer of all videos produced

Timeline:

The consultant is expected to complete the video filming and production within the project's timeline, with specific milestones and deadlines to be discussed upon contract commencement.

Qualifications:

- Proven experience in video filming and production, with a focus on sensitive storytelling and empowerment.
- A certificate in photography and videography.
- Understanding of ethical considerations when retelling stories of survivors of GBV.
- Strong communication skills

Budget:

The consultant should provide a comprehensive budget proposal detailing all costs associated with video filming and production services, including equipment rental, editing software, post-production, and any other relevant expenses.
