#### **ABOUT WCHO**

Women and Children Health Organization (WCHO) is a registered Non-Profit, National Non-Governmental Organization committed to working with other partners to find lasting solutions in ending gender inequality and discrimination and have access to life changing services and information through a vision of promoting a society where women, children and persons with disability have access to a better health and all other sustainable basic needs to realize their full potential in life. WCHO was founded in April 2018 and legally registered with RRC in 2020 by a group of philanthropic, professionals with diverse educational backgrounds and vast working experiences in emergency and development humanitarian innovations, who want to create impact on the health and wellbeing of women and children including persons with disability and sustainable environment they live in. WCHO believes that child survival is vital not only through the initial birth, but also includes on-going access to preventive healthcare, sanitation, nutrition, and education to save a life, and make it last.

### **JOB PURPOSE**

The Social Worker will assist in the provision of Protection-GBV Prevention (awareness raising) and response (linking to services) in project communities. He/she will be responsible for project design, planning, coordinating the community programs, facilitating trainings sessions, dialogues and dissemination of GBV prevention messages as well as referral pathway for the communities. This position is meant for the following locations; *Wanyiok*, *Warawar*, *Malual-baai*, *Mangar-tong and Yargot*, *in Aweil East County*, *Northern Bahr El-Ghazal State*.

### MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

 The Social Worker participates in protection, GBV prevention, outreach and community dialogue activities to enhance community response and prevention of violence against women and girls.

Provide support to the Case Worker for quality provision of community social services





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Conduct referrals of vulnerable women and girls to other partners within the project locations for support.

- Conduct needs assessment and monitor protection/GBV trends through data collection, and prepare summary report and share with the supervisor.
- Assess, identify and analyses community sensitive intervention geared towards building resilience and self- resilience among vulnerable women and girls.
- Carry out regular capacity building and training on GBV to the community structures
- Mentor and accompany identified community protection volunteers for project sustainability and ownership purpose.
- Prepare and provide weekly and monthly plans, reports and success stories to document WCHO community intervention in the project locations.
- In collaboration with local partners on the ground, coordinates and represents WCHO
  in meetings and issues regarding any community issues.

### **QUALIFICATION & EXPERIENCE**

- University Degree or Diploma in Social Sciences (.i.e Social Work, Counselling, Sociology, Psychology, Gender Studies or Human Rights).
- At least 2-3 years of experience in working with NNGO, INGO in the social sectors especially with IDP or emergency (affected population)
- Experience in supervising psychosocial programs, providing support and leading GBV related intervention
- Good communication and analytical skills
- Ability to communicate sensitive issues without being judgmental
- Good interpersonal skills including ability to gain trust and build relationships
- Good computer skills in both MSW, MSE, MSPP
- Be able to work in a stressful setting and adapt quickly to changing environment

#### **SKILLS AND ABILITIES**

- Ability to live in work in harsh location and especially in emergency situation
- Must be able to work independent with minimum supervision
- Ability to multitask and able to handle pressure well, improvise and flexible, cultural and environmental sensitivity
- Familiarity with issues of South Sudan and able to interact with the local communities

#### LANGUAGE

The candidate must be fluent in English as official language (written and spoken) as well as Local Arabic, but the knowledge of the local language spoke in project area is a plus.
