Purpose:

The Clinical Officer responsibility to support the effective implementation of quality health programming, including direct care as necessary, he/she will provide clinical services mainly in the outpatient and inpatient as required,

Major Responsibilities:

- Overseeing the clinical service at Outpatient department and ensure all the patients are taken care
 off with respect and dignity.
- Taking history, examining, diagnosing, and treating patients' common ailments at the outpatient health department.
- In collaboration with the team receive and attend to patients who require emergency services
- Appropriately refer or admit patients who require hospitalization or specialized services
- Attend ward rounds and participate in multidisciplinary patient care
- Undertaking clinical checks on all treatment sheets and prescriptions for suitability of treatment
- Regularly monitor the health and nutrition sites including Stabilization Centre to ensure services
 delivery are implemented in line to the country policies
- Conduct daily health education program at OPD to sensitize patients and clients on the good health practices,
- Keeping and Maintaining complete and up to date client records in collaboration with the MOH guidelines



- Participate in weekly and monthly CHD coordination meeting and update the health coordinator
- Work closely with SC, Nutrition and IPD staff to ensure all SC protocols are understood and agreed and appropriate referrals take place to and from the OTP.
- Participate and disseminate public health and Nutrition health education messages to improve, attitude and practice of the community in Jebel Boma.
- Support in surveillance of epidemic-prone diseases and reporting accordingly.
- Ensuring that regular inventories are conducted, and proper storage according to recommended standards. Monitor rational use of drugs periodically in comparison with morbidities.
- Produce timely weekly and monthly project update reports and proper internal reports for the coordination team.
- Carry out additional responsibilities as assigned.
