

Introduction

Christian Agenda for Development (CAD) is a faith based national non-governmental organization established in 2007 to address the humanitarian situation in South Sudan. CAD has a holistic, community driven approach to programming, ensuring that interventions are needs-driven and implemented in an inclusive integrated manner and in accordance with humanitarian principles.

Advancing HIV & AIDS Epidemic Control (AHEC) Activity is a USAID funded consortium led by IntraHealth to create a community-led response and aggressively strengthen HIV services along the prevention-to-care continuum, paying special attention to case finding and retention.

Through IntraHealth International, the South Sudanese government, and local communities, AHEC builds our capacity and resilience and adapt evidence-based HIV prevention, care, and treatment interventions for people living with HIV. With Year IV support, CAD will be implementing the Advancing HIV/AIDS Epidemic Control (AHEC) project in Juba, Tambura and Nagero counties of South Sudan. The project will provide technical assistance and services to decrease morbidity and mortality among South Sudanese

The AHEC project is anchored on two objectives;

- 1. Increase prevention, care, treatment, and retention services for at-risk men, women, children, and key populations.
- 2. Strengthen the capacity of local partners to prepare them for the receipt of prime funding.

Purpose of the position:

The ART Clinical Officer is responsible in the implementation of the AHEC project, which is to support optimized HIV case finding, treatment, viral suppression, and retention services by increasing access to facility and community-based HIV prevention, care, and treatment services and to improve retention across ART/PMTCT/EID/pediatric HIV cascade in accordance with the Ministry of Health standards

Primary responsibility

The Clinical Officer will provide leadership and technical oversight for Drop in Center. S/he will ensure that project implementation at the site is on track and in line with MoH guidelines and SOPs. S/he will work with other clinical staff to develop strategies and interventions on HIV services as they relate to Key Populations. S/he will have expertise and proven experience implementing technical assistance to accomplish project goals by working collaboratively with the MoH, SSAC and CSO partners and representative to scale up services for key populations. Will devote 100% of his/her time on this project, working with staff on a daily basis to ensure activities are carried out. Will supervise all the sites to stay on schedule and provide technical backstopping.

Key duty and responsibilities:

- Assist with analysis and report writing on HIV/AIDS assessments as needed.
- Design, implement, coordinate and evaluate a broad range of HIV care & treatment activities.
- Develop and implement administrative, operational, and programmatic procedures for partner organizations.
- Develop technical capacity and transfer technical expertise in training, learning, performance and support interventions, such as feedback and transfer of knowledge.
- Direct the use of state of the art technical approaches and methodologies in HIV care & treatment.
- Ensure all stocks are available at all times or ensure that the health facility is aware of the stock out.
- Ensure that HIV/AIDS clinical activities are implemented according to the South Sudan and international ethical guidelines and standards.
- Ensure that logistics are addressed and well planned for all training activities, including determining timing, space, allocation of per diems, and support for evaluation.
- Establish system for documentation and reporting of adherence and retention interventions.
- Identify problem areas in the implementation process and together with the technical team facilitate solutions.
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- Maintain and improve the quality of HIV clinical care and treatment.
- Meeting and coordinate with NGO partners, the CHD and local authorities.
- Oversee all clinical services to ensure that standards and national protocols are observed.
- Provide clinical consultation services for management of HIV and TB cases in the facility and catchment facilities.
- Provide clinical follow up of HIV exposed infants and their parents, facilities early infant diagnosis services and proper management of HIV infected children.
- Provide regular medical education to the facility staff.





- Represent CAD on HIV care & treatment issues at technical, policy and strategic planning meetings, including meetings with partners.
- Responsible for ART patient monitoring and discussing clients who fail on treatment with ART team for appropriate treatment interventions.
- Support quality improvement activities within the context of HIV/AIDS care & treatment.
- Willingness to work with Key populations
- Work with the HIV Testing and Counselling (HTC) providers to ensure accurate identification and linkage of HIV positive clients to care and treatment.
- Promote prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse
- Performs all other related duties involved in the operation of the DIC as assigned or required

Purpose of the position: The PMTCT/EID Midwife will oversee the day-to-day planning and implementation of PMTCT/EID activities at the health facility.

Key duty and responsibilities

 Provide full time clinical assessment, management and care of HIV positive pregnant and breastfeeding women and their families for preventing mother to child transmission

Provide clinical follow up, assessment and routine care of HIV exposed infants

 Provide early infant diagnosis services for HIV exposed infants including taking DBS blood samples for DNA PCR tests in line with MOH guidelines

Follow up the baby -mother pair till when the last test outcome is determined in line with existing MOH standards

Follows and documents all the EID test results in the appropriate EID registers as required by Ministry of Health

Provide routine antenatal and postnatal care services to pregnant and breast-feeding women attending the ANC and PMTCT Clinics

Ensure all pregnant women presenting at the health facility ANC and PNC are counseled and receive HTS services to identify the HIV positive mothers and exposed infants to be enrolled into care /PMTCT

Support the counseling of all HIV positive mothers to ensure adherence to treatment and retention in care

Provide HIV and AIDS information for all pregnant and breastfeeding women who attend the ANC. PNC FP.

Provide infant and young child feeding counseling to mothers attending ANC and PMTCT clinics

Follow up of pregnant and breast-feeding women and HIV exposed infants who missed their clinic appointments

Maintain proper updated records of all HIV positive pregnant and breastfeeding women and exposed infants in the PMTCT Clinic

Support the mentor mothers to provide psychosocial, adherence and follow up support to HIV infected pregnant and breastfeeding mothers and their exposed infant

Counsel HIV clients on regimen specific side effects and dispense ARVs to clients

Provide FP services and condoms to clients

Promote prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse

Primary responsibilities

The Data Clerk is responsible for HIV patient files and the overall facility data collection and reporting

Key duty and responsibilities:

- Assemble patient's files in a correct and orderly manner to ensure that all the patients' files and information are easily accessible and well organized in the files, shelves, and cabinets.
- Ensure all hard copies and soft copies of the reports are kept confidential.
- Put into the files all the clients' documents such as HIV test results, treatment prescription, Viral load and CD4 results, TB screening results, and or any relevant test results.
- Create new files for new clients at the center and ensure that all necessary forms are attached to the patient files.
- Complete attendance records for the clients at the unit.
- Call clients who have been lost to follow up at the facility.
- Guide clients and visitors at the unit to ensure organization and easy flow of services.
- Enter accurate data into databases as per the project and MOHSS data collection and reporting guidelines and procedures
- Compile daily, weekly and monthly reports for the clinical team to review and make decisions based on the data
- Submit reports periodically and on an ad hoc basis as required by MOHSS or IntraHealth using different means such as email, telephone, or hard copies
- Order stationeries as may be directed by the doctor, clinical officer, or nurse
- Follow up clients who missed their appointments using the appointment logbook or tracking tool
- Work closely with adherence counselors/peer navigators and PLHIV support group members to stay
 in touch with clients to prevent lost to follow up
- Ensure that all HIV data and reports produced in the facility are correct, complete, and reliable
- Ensure confidentiality and integrity during all stages of HIV related data management

- Update clients contacts, contacts of clients newly started ART and those with high viral load
- Tracks HIV testing services trends to elicited partners of index cases and documents progress in Index testing register
- Identify potential barriers to adherence and assist the clients to make a plan for overcoming the barriers
- Ensure that all patients have adherence assessment forms in their files with clear documentation of adherence outcomes
- Educate clients on the component of positive living
- Map community resources of support for clients on ART and facilitate client's referral and linkage to those resources
- Facilitate establishment of adherence support groups and recruit clients to join them
- Establish system for documentation and reporting of adherence and retention interventions
- Work with facility-based peer adherence supporters to facilitate facility-community linkages through PLHIV association.
- Dispense drugs to clients
- Update the dispensing register
- Promote prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse



Primary responsibilities

The Nurse shall provide intermediate-level, professional public health nursing services including assessment, counseling and testing to clients at a Drop-in Center (DIC) for female sex workers

Key duty and responsibilities:

- Assures quality of care by adhering to Ministry of Health guidelines.
- Collects blood samples and other laboratory specimens as part of assessment and diagnosis process
- Coordinate linkage between HIV testing point and the ART unit.
- Counsel and administer PEP to the needy clients
- Counselling of clients on ARVs side effects and dispense the ARVs drugs.
- Document client tracking in the tracking register.
- Elicits health histories related to sexual activity and presenting symptoms (i.e., previous STD's pregnancy, contraceptive history, etc.)
- Implement weekly meetings with the staff.
- Lead the implementation of the appointment system in the ART unit including use client held cards, appointment log, and identification and tracking of missed appointment.
- Lead the tracking of the clients who missed their appointments and lost to follow up.
- Maintain positive working relationship with clients and colleagues and embrace professionalism, team working, integrity, and medical work ethics.
- Make follow up calls regarding attendance to the facility appointment including reminding clients of an appointment, exploring reasons of missing an appointment and assisting clients with rescheduling an appointment.
- Performs all clinical tasks following established policies and protocols
- Create awareness and train team members on zero tolerance on sexual exploitation & abuse
- Performs group and one-on-one education specific to HIV/STD and other communicable disease to the Key Populations at the DIC
- Performs specialized counseling and testing on HIV and screening for Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) utilizing appropriate protocols and guidelines
- Provide competent efficient nursing care by providing monitoring HIV progression with emphasis on the viral load and development of AIDS.
- Provide Family Planning (FP) services and condoms and lubricants to clients
- Provide health education on HIV/STDs and other communicable diseases to HIV clients and the key populations at the 4 sites.
- Provides information to clients, regarding infection and instructions medication administration
- Responsible of the ARVs and other HIV commodities stock level, ordering and submitting monthly commodity consumption report.
- Track families of the index clients for counselling and testing.
- Uses test results and clinical assessment to determine type and stage of STD and administer appropriate treatment allowed under protocol
- Promote prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse
- Performs all other related duties involved in the operation of the DIC as assigned or required



Qualifications and skills

- Certificate / Diploma in Nursing from a recognized health institution.
- At least two years of work experience working for a recognized health facility.
- Ability to communicate in English, Local Arabic and local language is an advantage.
- Good interpretation skills and ability to uphold patient confidentiality.
