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givers and families. Under the supervision of PHC Coordinator, the following specific tasks & responsibilities will be assigned to the Mental Health Officer through the MHPSS Specialist.

MAIN TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Assist the Mental Health Specialist / PHC coordinator with the integration of mental health and psychosocial support into general health care.
- Provide psychosocial support services linked to general health care clinics.
- Select and provide training and supervise community psychosocial workers in project location assigned.
- Develop culturally appropriate psychosocial activities, including social support activities for targeted population. These include but are not limited to training in psychological first aid, designing holistic recreational, and social activities; development of material for awareness campaigns.
- Serve as a point of contact between IMC and local partners involved in psychosocial activities under the guidance of the MHPSS specialist.
- Strengthen community-facility referral system for refugees with mental and psychosocial problems.
- Work in keeping with IASC guidelines on mental health and psychosocial support and promote guidelines where appropriate.
- Work closely with other mental health and psychosocial staff to ensure coordinated activities.
- Collaborate with informal service providers such as natural healers to facilitate information sharing and referral of mental health cases.
- Collaborate with community and existing institutional structures to ensure protection of those suffering from mental illness.
- Keep records updated and share required information with MHPSS team at site level.
- Compile information and prepare written reports as necessary.
- Organize public awareness and de-stigmatization campaigns around mental health issues with support from local staff including refugee volunteers.



- Represent IMC in coordination meetings when assigned to do so by the MHPSS specialist or immediate supervisor.
- Implement other activities as per the direction of the mental health specialist managing the MHPSS project.

Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse

- Actively promote PSEA (Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) standards within IMC and amongst vendors-suppliers and beneficiaries served by IMC.

Compliance & Ethics: Promotes and encourages a culture of compliance and ethics throughout International Medical Corps. As applicable to the position, maintains a clear understanding of International Medical Corps' and donor compliance and ethics standards and adheres to those standards. Conducts work with the highest level of integrity.

Ethical conduct for IMC Staffs: The International Medical Corps maintains a code of standards of conduct that shall govern the performances of its employees engaged in the award and administration of contracts. - Diploma/Certificate in Mental Health Nursing
- Diploma in clinical medicine/ Registered Nursing from a recognized institution.
- Two years' experience in the related MHPSS activities with INGO is an added advantage.
- Strong knowledge of IASC for MHPSS in Emergency setting is an added advantage.
- Good experience and knowledge of MHPSS related topics such as mhGAP-HIG and PFA.
- Training and capacity building skills on MHPSS related topics including mhGAP-HIG and PFA and MHCM are a plus.
- Possess good supervision skills and reporting.



- Able to work on multiple tasks in difficult situations and meet deadlines.
- Ability to communicate well (including writing skills).
