	Support the establishment and operationalization of a comprehensive, dedicated, and flexible customized DHIS platform to collect, track, record and share data on GBV, networking with all existing sectoral and decentralized databases including the MOH DHIS	
	Establish a comprehensive integrated data hub and portal on different GBV, and promote a culture of open data, with the development of a user-friendly web-based database accessible to users, including decision makers at all levels Support national capacity building to produce GBV data that is Government of South Sudan owned	
Background Information	Currently, South Sudan lucks a National Gender Based Violence database owned and management by Government. The purpose of this consultancy is to design a national GBV database to collect, store and analyze GBV data in development settings. The database aim to collect GBV incident data to facilitate evidence-based decision making at all levels especially at the point of collection. It will enable all actors in South Sudan who are responding to GBV to safely collect, store and generate analyzed reports in real time.	
	The National GBV database will be hosted and managed by MGCSW. This will be a crucial step towards a multi-sectoral and coordinated effort towards elimination of Gender Based Violence under the Government leadership.	
	UNFPA in partnership with Ministry of Health and Ministry of Gender, Child and Social Welfare established the Family Protection Centre often referred as One Stop Centre (OSC) since late 2017. OSC is a multi-sectoral gender-based violence (GBV) facility that supports the survivors of GBV with integrated medical, psychological support, legal aid and referral services based on the survivors' needs in the situation, and her/his choices.	
	Currently the OSCs have been operational in 13 locations and 1 safe house across South Sudan in collaboration with the State Ministry of Gender, Child and Social Welfare, Ministry of Health, and GBV response civil society organizations.	
	UNFPA as the led UN agency on GBV prevention and response is committed to support the Government of Republic of South Sudan under the leadership of MGCSW in fully harnessing the power of data revolution to efficiently monitor key indicators of development and enable informed and timely decision-making to reduce the country's vulnerabilities, accelerate the achievement of the Zero GBV including child marriage
