SUMMARY OF THE POSITION

The mentor is an important key to a successful trainee experience. The clinical mentor must take an active role by working closely with the trainee (student) to provide guidance, on job training, support, and health care facility assessment, help define a strong career development plan, and serve as a role model for the trainee. The following description of the mentor's role and guidelines for serving in that role are offered to provide assistance:

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work with Program Leadership in determining the overall mission, vision, goals and objectives of the Program. Ensures the implementation of a strategic plan that makes consistent and timely progress towards Program goals.
- Work with the Ebola Training Team (SP ETT) Program Manager (PM) and Deputy PM to support Samaritan's Purse' (SP) Ebola Preparedness Response (SP EPR) related trainings and activities.
- To attend staff devotions at 08.00 every day as required of all SP staff.
- To participate in the delivery of training courses, mentorship and conduct assessments to a consistent and fair standard in accordance with SP requirements.
- The mentor must ensure frequent interaction with the trainee. Schedule regular.
- meetings with the trainee to make sure that he/she understands all expectations and to
- Monitor the progress toward his/her educational, clinical and career development goals.
- Provide constructive feedback to trainees, encouraging trainees to self- identify strengths and weaknesses.
- The mentor should assist the trainee in developing a plan to master clinical knowledge, Acumen, and technical skills to achieve mastery in the field of clinical oncology.
- The mentor must provide a range of appropriate experiences for the trainee: using role play, managing common Ebola related scenarios and practical experience.
- The mentor should constantly encourage and assist the trainee to make progress on Mastering clinical practice.
- The mentor should create opportunities to introduce the trainee to thought leaders and
- Master clinicians at other institutions, who have similar interests.
- The mentor should provide assessment and constructive feedback, and document the
- Trainee's clinical progress and performance.

- To maintain current competence and continuous personal development
- To work within Samaritan Purse health and safety, training and other policies and procedures as implemented within the organization.
- To pilot new initiatives in training when required.
- To be responsible for custody, maintenance and transport of personal equipment.
- Attend and contribute to Technical working groups (TWG) as needed and the National Task Force (NTF) meetings and report back to the SP ETT PM.
- Liaise with the implementing partners (IP's) in order to arrange ongoing training and mentoring for staff from within the health facilities.
- Implementing accepted tools conduct assessment of health facilities as needed.

- Front line experience in programs for infectious diseases, education and or management.
- Ebola preparedness training including full PPE.
- Experience as a Trainer or Mentor.

- Ability to write and speak in English.
- Experience as a trainer (TOT).
- Ability to work in a hostile environment with only basic necessities.

- Ability to work in a cross-cultural setting.
- Ready to work in different Health Care facilities based in Juba, Nimule, Yei and Maridi.
