

TENDER FOR SUPPLY AND DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD PACKS IN WARRAP STATE (GOGRIAL EAST)

Islamic Relief South Sudan (IRSS) is an independent humanitarian and development UK based organization, with an active presence in over 40 Countries across the globe, we strive to make the world a better and fairer place for people still living in poverty. Islamic relief began its humanitarian operation in South Sudan Since 2004, focusing on providing lifesaving aid and implementing developmental Programmes to support people affected by flood, drought and Conflict. IRSS has three sub offices where it operates in South Sudan (Narus, (Kapoeta East), Wau, Warrap with a satellite office in Yei and Main office in Juba.

IRSS is responding to floods and conflicts affected population in four Payams in Gogrial East County of Warrap State. 700 most vulnerable HHs will be provided with lifesaving emergency food assistance in Gogrial East County and to enhance food security through resilience livelihood among the vulnerable households in Warrap. The project will be implemented in four Payams of Gogrial East County namely; **Pathuon West, Pathuon East, Toch West** and **Toch North.**

Through the FAIR Project with funding from Islamic Relief United Kingdom to support the affected population in addressing their needs through provision of emergency food assistance, creating resilience through agricultural practices and provision of food packs at the household level, this required procurement of the items by the potential vendors to procure and supply food packs. Through this procurement, the following will be supplied to target beneficiaries: **Supply of food items** 700 HHs targeted beneficiaries will receive the food packs, in the first round FAIR distribution, therefore 700 vulnerable HHs will be distributed with 90 kg sorghum, 9 kg Beans, 1 litres vegetable cooking oil and 1kg salt for each Household in the first procurement, second round and third round procurement of food packs for 700 HHs in the four Payams of Gogrial East County of Warrap State.
