TEAM PURPOSE: To implement the projects according to scope, quality, timeline and as per the budgeted resources, to work with stakeholders to find lasting solutions to poverty and suffering **JOB PURPOSE:** To ensure the delivery of quality Emergency Food Security and Livelihoods (EFSL) intervention at the Location of intervention in line with Oxfam and internationally accepted humanitarian standards. He/she will be responsible for overall daily management and implementation of Oxfam's food security and livelihoods activities in the County of deployment. The Sr. Officer will guide, train, direct and support Extension Agents in implementing food security and Livelihoods activities while also providing monitoring and evaluation tools to assess progress against agreed objectives.

The EFSL officer is ultimately responsible for ensuring timely, orderly implementation of the emergency food security and livelihoods interventions for the SSHF funded emergency livelihoods response project in

Key Responsibilities

- To carry out effective mobilization & sensitization of community & other key stakeholders on project implementation strategies
- Direct line management of SSHF Emergency Response and EFSVL team in Nyirol and Uror Counties including performance review, on job training, support, encouragement and correction.
- Act as Oxfam representative to stakeholders for all matters concerning SSHF response project in areas of Nyirol and Uror.
- Contribute to a clear strategy for the emergency food security and livelihoods programming in collaboration with the Response Lead.
- Ensure all project activities are conducted in accordance with agreed work-plan and proposal.
- Submit monthly and quarterly reports to the Emergency Response Programme Manager, including activity summary, progress against objectives, etc.
- Leads coordination of field level inputs for donor reports or needs assessment related to FSL sectors.
- Ensure coordination of all activities at County-level with relevant Local Government leaders, INGOs and CBOs, and community stakeholders, and maintain constant coordination with RRC on project implementation. Job profile template version 1 – 17.03.20
- Ensure Emergency Livelihoods Response Project is designed to address specific needs of women, men, boys and girls by mainstreaming gender in all food security and livelihoods program in coordination with gender team
- Provide regular orientation to team on promoting the Oxfam gender pick up and go modules, Oxfam Minimum Standards for Gender in Emergencies and checklists in all Oxfam focus areas with technical support from the gender team
- Ensure teams work according to clear workplans, and work within a framework of clear objectives of FSL
- To lead food security assessments and surveys amongst emergency affected populations and advise on appropriate EFSVL programming along with issues management of FSL sectoral interventions.
- Remain available to be deployed to support EFSVL activities in any Oxfam Area programme office, available as surge member to support responses related to EFSVL.
- Ensure support to help start the intervention through support in developing workplans and sharing the clear project deliverables with the team.
- Establish a framework for documenting learning from the SSHF project including gender and protection main streaming (set up database) which becomes operationalized for documenting and tracking information on food security and livelihood interventions.
- Support in producing regular reports and contribute donor final report, 5W reporting to the Response Manager on food security and livelihoods activities.
- Represent Oxfam GB at certain meetings involving local government and sector ministries at state and national level as directed by line management.
- Ensure adequate technical support to the food security/livelihoods and monitoring staff and stand in for the Response Programme manager in his/her absence.
- Support capacity building to staff hands on work to ensure that adhere to approved approaches and processes to ensure quality timely delivery of the interventions.

SKILLS AND COMPETENCE: ESSENTIAL

- Bachelor's degree in any discipline related to food security and livelihood and Social Sciences.
- A minimum of five years' experience in management of food security and livelihood project or community mobilization in a humanitarian setting in an International or Multinational Organization

- Sensitivity, diplomacy, tact, good communication skills, and ability to remain calm under pressure.
 - Well-developed interpersonal and team skills.
 - Good administrative skills in order to work with people at managerial and senior government levels.
 - The ability to present concise reports, sometimes short notice.
 - Ability to coordinate activities with other agencies, build and maintain positive working relationships.
 - Ability to understand complex security situations and adjust operations accordingly.
 - Experience in monitoring and evaluation of humanitarian programmes
 - Flexibility, willingness to travel and work in difficult circumstances.
 - Good understanding of humanitarian protection standards, Sphere Minimum Standards, gender issues and Code of conduct as relevant to food distribution activities.

 - Demonstrated experience of integrated gender and diversity issues into humanitarian programmes
