Job Purpose:

The MHPSS Officer will be in charge of the implementation and supervision of mental health programme in all Counties where RI operates. She/he will provide training to health staff as well as community members, management and technical support to ensure quality of the programme. She/he will also be responsible for the reporting.

Main Roles & Responsibility/ Duties:

- Provide initial training on MH Gap identification and management to health workers
- Conduct capacity needs assessment to all health facility staff on MHPSS.
- Provide on the job training- mentoring to the health workers
- Coordinate with health workers on daily basis to ensure MHPSS is integrated in all departments (Health and Nutrition mainly) and patients are identify and receive the adequate treatment.
- Train the HHPs on identification and referral of cases
- Provide Counselling to people with mental health problems including their care givers
- Conduct Coping up activities that provide psychological support to the mentally ill persons.
- Consolidate weekly and monthly reports plus analysis of the attendance and morbidity. To put in place an actions plan to address any issue



- Lead community mobilization /awareness on MHPSS on the availability of services, its attendances, on prevention of MHPSS, on any emerging MHPSS related issue; As well as the roles of the community on the success of the programme
- To conduct home visit to patients to provide support and guide the family members on how to support the patient.
- Maintain up to date records on above functions for provision of reports to supervisors as requested.

Policy compliance - Mandatory Reporting Policy (MRP):

- Ensure any violations of the RI Sexual Abuse and Exploitation Code of Conduct are reported to the Program Manager. The reporting of violations is an obligation on the part of all staff members.
- Assist where necessary in undertaking activities that aim to prevent the occurrence of sexual abuse and exploitation of beneficiaries by RI and other humanitarian workers

The success of the RI's humanitarian mission is the highest priority and all issues which arise
must be addressed accordingly. Therefore, the MHPSS Officer will be required to support in
unforeseen issues and circumstances and remain flexible to perform other duties, as and when
required by supervisor.

Minimum Job Qualification and Requirements:

- Psychiatric nurse or diploma in Psychosocial work with minimum 2 years of experience in MH Gap implementation
- Clinical officer with knowledge of MH Gap and 2 years minimum in management of Mental health cases
- Excellent in training, analytical, organizational and coordination skills
- Experience in supervision, capacity building, mentoring and reporting
- Good relationship with community and beneficiaries
- Able to keep high confidentiality of the beneficiaries conditions
- Ability and desire to work effectively in a team as well as independently;
- Experience in training, facilitation and supervision;
- Good organizational skills;
- Good interpersonal and communication skills in English and local language (Nuer);

General Condition:
