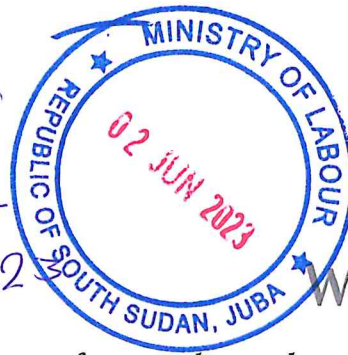

### **Purpose of the position:**

The Senior Project Manager and Technical Lead will provide coordination and technical support for the implementation of interventions related to CORE Group Partners Project Global Health Security (GHS) interventions in South Sudan. The incumbent will build capacity of project staff and provide technical guidance on GHS and zoonotic disease prevention, detection, reporting, and response. He/she will ensure highest quality of the work. As required, the GHS Technical Lead will work with the implementing NGO staff, headquarters-based staff and country level stakeholders to oversee the implementation, coordination, monitoring, reporting, representation, and information sharing on GHS intervention in South Sudan.

### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Oversee and facilitate the planning, implementation, and reporting of CGPP-GHS project activities in South Sudan.
- Work closely with the CCGPP Global Senior GHS Advisor, USAID South Sudan GHS advisor, and Secretariat team to support the development, review, implementation, and monitoring of technical approaches and strategies for strengthening the response to community-based zoonotic diseases surveillance and response as related to the GHS deliverables, reporting, knowledge
- Work with (MOH), MoARF, MOE, GHS partners, and other implementing partners at national, state, and county levels to process, analyze and use One Health/GHS information to improve management and learning for effective implementation
- Contribute to the analysis of public health, animal health, wildlife, and environmental services to identify vertical and horizontal linkages useful for community based zoonotic disease surveillance
- Participate in national, regional, and international GHS
- With support from the CGPP South Sudan Secretariat Deputy Director, provide on-site technical and organizational development support to the NGO implementing agencies/County One Health



mechanisms to strengthen multi-sectoral and multidisciplinary collaboration on community-based zoonotic disease surveillance, prevention, reporting, and outbreak response.

- Conduct quarterly and ad hoc field monitoring visits for all implementing partners to verify data and program activities and make recommendations
- Participate in developing/ reviewing the project log frame/ performance frameworks for evidence-based program decisions and USAID reporting and detailed M&E implementation plans for the CGPP-GHS
- Ensure that all necessary equipment including Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and other supplies are prepositioned to each screening point on time.
- Coordinate and facilitate all evidence gathering activities including program evaluations, research activities, and case studies/success stories.
- Track performance on established input, activity, output, effect, and impact indicators to measure achievement and track progress towards intermediate results and overall program strategic objectives.
- In coordination with the MEAL officer, ensure the collection and organization of GHSA information in accordance with USAID GHSA M&E Framework.

#### **Qualifications/Education/Knowledge/Technical Skills and Experience.**

The following may be acquired through a combination of formal or self-education, prior experience or on-the-job training:

##### **Minimum Qualification required: Bachelor Degree in development Studies or a related field**

- Advanced Degree (MBBS/MBChB, DVM and preferably Masters in Public Health, Animal health, epidemiology, Preventive Medicine and/or related biomedical disciplines.
- At 10 years' experience in progressive in addressing human and animal health threats with at least 5 years Managerial exposure.
- Good knowledge of One Health concepts, GHSA, WHO's Joint External Evaluation, World Organization for Animal Health Performance for Veterinary Services, and the IHR-2005 principles.
- Demonstrated experience in applying One Health approaches to address community-based disease challenges.
- Strong understanding of the South Sudan national One Health and community health Strategy.
- Prior experience working in public health programs in developing countries supported by bilateral agencies such as USAID, CDC and international agencies such as the FAO, OIE, and WHO preferred.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills with ability to build consensus and constructively lead teams.
- Possession of analytical, problem- solving, and strategic planning skills
- Excellent interpersonal, organizational, and written/verbal communication skills, including in cross-cultural settings.
- Previous experience working in a consortium and as a team player with the demonstrated professional maturity to work with a multi-sector team to deliver combined results.
- Proficiency in information management systems, EPI Info, MS Excel, SPSS, GIS, and other data management software and MS Office.
- Experience working in a cross-cultural environment.
- Willingness to work and travel to hardship locations.
- Strong knowledge and understanding of the humanitarian industry (relief, development, and advocacy), including how INGOs operate in the global and local contexts.
- Good networking skills.
- Experience in working on resilience and/or development programming in fragile contexts preferred.
- Experience leading proposal development processes
- Prior training in resource acquisition and proposal development
